The original term could be either a few months shorter or longer than 20 years, depending on when the parking lot opens. The rather complicated

language in paragraph 10 relative to the renewal option is intended to avoid the problem of having the Village overlook the date for giving notice to renew the lease. Paragraph 10 provides that the option to renew continues until 30 days after the owner gives notice to the Village that it is time to exercise the option. The provision prohibiting traffic to enter onto Hough Street and providing for right turns only for entrance and egress are in paragraph 9 but specify that the Village can change those provisions unilaterally.

5. A Rezoning Ordinance, in the form previously submitted to you, except for a change in the date from 1968 to 1969.

As requested, we hereby offer to structure a financing program for the Village's Motor Vehicle Parking System and to use our best efforts to secure the private placement with an investor(s) of approximately \$200,000 Village of Barrington, Illinois (the "Village") Motor Vehicle Parking System Revenue Bonds, Series 1969 (the "Bonds") to finance site acquisition and improvement costs. The Bonds are to be offered at a price of par (100% of their principal value) plus accrued interest to the date of delivery of the bonds, substantially in accordance with the following terms and conditions:

1. The Bonds shall be dated April 1, 1969, shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 each and shall bear interest payable October 1, 1969 and semi-annually thereafter on each April 1 and October 1, both principal and interest to be payable at such bank or trust company as we may designate. The Bonds shall bear interest at a rate of 6% per annum and shall mature on April 1 each year as follows:

- 2. The Bonds maturing in the years 1970 through 1979, inclusive, shall not be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities. Bonds maturing in the years 1980 through 19_____, inclusive, shall be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities on or after April 1, 1979 or on any interest payment date thereafter at the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.
- 3. The Bonds shall be authorized and secured by an ordinance drafted by Messrs. Chapman and Cutler, Chicago, Illinois, Bond Counsel, in form and content satisfactory to us and which shall provide that payment of the principal and interest on the Bonds shall constitute a first lien upon the net revenues of the Parking System.

3. (cont.)

The ordinance shall contain the usual provisions as to flow of funds and other covenants common to bond issues of this type and security.

- 4. The Bonds shall be accompanied at the time of their delivery by:
 - a. the unqualified approving legal opinion of Messrs. Chapman and Cutler satisfactory to us evidencing the legality of the bonds,
 - b. an executed non-litigation certificate and other delivery papers in customary market form, and
 - c. two complete, true and correct manually executed copies of the Official Statement of the Village in connection with the issuance of the Bonds.

The Bonds shall be delivered at such bank or trust company or in our Chicago, Illinois offices as we designate on or before May 1, 1969, or such other place or later date as may be necessary and is approved by us in writing.

- 5. Incident to this transaction, we agree to pay the cost of the preparation and printing of the Official Statement and our out-of-pocket expenses. All other costs incidental to this financing, including the printing of the Bonds, legal expenses, and delivery expenses shall be paid by the Village.
- 6. Upon our successfully arranging with an investor(s) for the placement of the Bonds, we shall so notify the Village and the delivery of the Bonds shall be scheduled. In consideration for our services in structuring the financing program and successfully placing the Bonds, the Village agrees to pay us a fee of 2.5% of the principal amount of the Bonds at the closing. If for any reason the Bonds are not issued, the Village will not be liable to us for any fees for our services rendered or in reimbursement for our out-of-pocket expenses.

Your approval and acceptance of this offer as evidenced by your execution of the acceptance clause below shall cause this to constitute an agreement and contract for the placement of the Bonds herein described, subject to and in accordance with the terms and conditions herein outlined and established. This agreement shall be in effect for a period of six months from its date of acceptance and shall be automatically extended

from month to month thereafter for such period of time as is necessary to complete this financing, unless terminated after the end of such sixmonth period by either party upon 30 days' written notice to the other.

Materials to be collected shall include the following:

- All kitchen wastes including cans, bottles, household food, accumulation of animal food and vegetable matter attendant on the preparation, use, cooking and serving of foods.
- 2. General household trash and refuse, including ashes, empty cartons, crates, boxes, wrapping materials, newspapers and magazines when securely and neatly bound in convenient size bundles, cloth materials, empty cans, discarded toys, discarded clothing and similar materials.
- 3. Discarded furniture including beds, springs, matresses, overstuffed furniture and other furniture, appliances, bicycles, sleds, swing sets, tools and comparable items.
- 4. Yard refuse materials, including grass clippings, weeds, Christmas trees, bushes, brush clippings and branch clippings (when securely bound in bundles not exceeding four feet in length.

Business Is Almous Picking Up

Materials not to be taken include the following:

Earth, sod, rocks, concrete, refuse from remodeling or construction of homes, and trees or parts thereof (with the exception of small branches bundled as provided in paragraph 4 above). This does not exclude small amounts of earth, sod and building materials resulting from "do it yourself" projects, if such are placed in garbage cans.

The maintenance and repair of Hillside Avenue is shared by the State of Illinois and the County of Cook. The State responsibility begins at Northwest Highway and ends at Prairie Avenue; from there on it is Cook County's responsibility.

The problem on East Hillside is not new to my office and I have been in contact with the State for over a year. I am now informed the State will give priority to the following:

- 1. Rough Road signs will be installed until the road can be repaired.
- 2. Class A type barricades will be installed.
- 3. Guardrails will be installed.
- 4. Curve, arrow and other signs required will be installed.
- 5. Overhead lighting will be provided.

It has been requested that proper storm drainage on the north side of Hillside Avenue be provided by the Village. I have asked our Director of Public Works to investigate this problem and provide my office with his recommendations.
