VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

Minutes of May 21, 1979

The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at 8:00 p.m. at the Village Hall on May 21, 1979. President Hansen called the meeting to order at 8:05 p.m. Roll Call.

Mrs. Hansen asked for approval of the minutes of the meeting of April 23, 1979. Mr. Hamill motioned for approval of the minutes as corrected. Mrs. Wellington seconded. Minutes approved.

FINANCE - Norman Tucker

In Mr. Tucker's absence, Mrs. Hansen reviewed the 12-month Treasurer's Report and noted that the Village ended its fiscal year with a surplus of approximately \$90,000. of income over expenses. Mrs. Hansen asked for approval of the Treasurer's Report. Motion for approval was made by Mr. MacArthur, with Mr. Hamill seconding. Motion approved.

Mrs. Hansen then noted that the Village's financial position is quite favorable and she recommended that the current utility tax being assessed on telephone, gas and light bills be reduced by 50 percent. This recommendation was favorably received by all trustees and Mr. Craig was instructed to prepare the proper resolution for the June meeting.

Mrs. Hansen asked for approval of \$12,799.34 in bills to be paid. Mr. Hamill motioned for approval and Mr. Kempe seconded. Roll call.

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Mrs. Hansen asked for approval of the firm of McGladrey, Hendrickson & Company to conduct the audit for fiscal 1978-79. Mr. Kempe motioned for approval, and Mrs. Wellington seconded. Roll call.

Mrs. Hansen reminded all those present that the Public Hearing on the use of Revenue Sharing Funds in the proposed Appropriation Ordinance, and the Public Hearing on the proposed Appropriation Ordinance, has been scheduled for 8:15 p.m. on June 25, 1979. Mr. Craig will prepare the proper notices for publication.

PUBLIC SAFETY - Alexander MacArthur and Chief Schuld

Mr. MacArthur noted that the Village of Fox River Grove plans several outdoor concerts to raise money for the Norge Ski Club. These could occur on the same night that Poplar Creek has a concert, thus presenting a problem in crowd control on opposite ends of the Village. He stated that our general policy would be to protect our Village residents first. Mr. MacArthur noted that when villages enter into contracts to permit public gatherings, they should also provide adequate security. He will discuss this problem with the McHenry County Sheriff's office and report back to the Chief of Police and Mrs. Hansen.

Chief Schuld reviewed the monthly activity report. In referring to the accident involving two Barrington Hills policemen, Chief Schuld noted that over 500,000 miles have been driven since the last accident involving a squad car.

PLANNING - Jonathan C. Hamill

<u>Plan Commission</u> - The May meeting was the annual organizational meeting. Maryjo Garre was elected Vice-Chairman and Sheila Hurley was elected Secretary for the current fiscal year. Procedures were agreed upon whereby a majority vote of the full Commission would be required to approve subdivision plats for referral to the Village Board. Also, at this meeting, there was a preliminary review of Sutton Creek Subdivision (27 lots on 143 acres at Dundee/Sutton Roads). Rolling Hills and Woodview Trails will be coming up soon for final plat review.

<u>PDO</u> - The joint committee of the Plan Commission and the Zoning Board held its final meeting on May 16, 1979. All members were present; however, no more than ten residents attended. By a vote of 13 to 1, it was recommended that the final draft of the PDO be referred to the Village Board. We have received the first draft of the soil ordinance from Mr. Lenzini which is proposed as an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance. This would require a public hearing by the Zoning Board of Appeals. Since the PDO and the Soil Overlay Ordinance are so closely related, Mr. Hamill suggested they be considered together by the Village Board. Present plans call for a review of the soil ordinance by the Plan Commission in June, a public hearing before the ZBA on July 16, 1979, and then consideration of both ordinances by the Village Board in August. Mr. Teska has been requested to make a preliminary list of natural areas in the Village for possible use as an inventory.

ZONING AND ENFORCEMENT - James A. Kempe

ZBA - Mr. Kempe reported that there was no ZBA meeting in the month of May. On April 16, 1979, the Zoning Board denied the petition for a variation by the Braun Manufacturing and Best Line Fence Companies. Messrs. Kempe and MacArthur asked for some immediate action on this violation. Mr. Craig was asked to expedite this matter.

Mr. Kempe reviewed the Building Department report for April 16 through May 15, 1979. Ten permits were issued. 2 houses, 3 pools, 1 garage, 1 storage unit, 1 riding arena and 1 each for a horse barn and horse barn rebuilding permit.

Property Owners Request - Osran, Ridge Road - The homeowners request was read to the trustees by Mr. Kempe. It appears the homeowners on adjacent property would prefer that Mr. Osran not build the proposed new driveway because they do not want the road. It was explained that Mr. Osran's barn is improperly located and was built without a permit until he agreed to build the road in order that the barn would conform. Mr. Osran was asked if he wished to seek a variation but he stated he would need to seek his attorney's advice before giving an answer to the question. Because the entire matter is presently being litigated, no final decision was reached by the trustees.

ROADS AND BRIDGES - Louis J. Klein, Jr.

In Mr. Klein's absence, Mrs. Hansen noted that we are progressing quite well with emergencies since we have our own truck and the services of our road inspector, George Knigge.

Mrs. Hansen asked for approval of \$52,000. in Motor Fuel Tax Funds for the 1979 Road Maintenance Program. Mr. MacArthur motioned for approval. Mr. Kempe seconded. Roll call.

ADMINISTRATION - Barbara P. Hansen

Tralee Farm Restaurant - Mrs. Hansen informed the trustees that numerous state health violations are pending and until such time as they are resolved and clearance is received from the state, no liquor license will be issued by the Village.

Intergovernmental Agreement with Barrington (Route 14 and Barrington Road boundaries)-Mrs. Hansen asked for trustee imput and desired changes so that the agreement could be redrafted and action taken in June. The Barrington Village Board will meet on May 28, 1979 and will consider the agreement at that time.

Norge Summer Festival - Mr. Hamill motioned for passage of a resolution opposing this outdoor musical festival on the grounds that it will create noise, litter, congestion and traffic problems, causing a substantial expense to our Village. Mr. Kempe seconded. Roll call.

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Personnel Committee - Mr. Kempe noted that the sick leave, vacation and holiday employee policies had been reviewed by the committee and Mr. Kempe recommended the Village adopt said policies. Mr. MacArthur proposed that Columbus Day be eliminated as an official holiday and that the individual employee's birthday be substituted in its place. Mr. Kempe then motioned for adoption of the policies with this change. Mrs. Wellington seconded. Roll call.

Dear Mr. Hamill:

The following action was taken by the Plan Commission at its regularly scheduled May meeting:

KROHA'S SUBDIVISION

- 1. Approved the preliminary plat with the stipulation that an existing barn be shown on Lot 2 prior to submittal of the plat to the Board of Trustees.
- 2. The requirement for new percolation tests was waived due to a previous test taken in March of 1976 on the one vacant parcel.

PRICE SUBDIVISION

A pre-platting presentation was made showing the subdivision of a 16 acre tract into 6 and 10 acre lots.

SUTTON CREEK SUBDIVISION

A pre-sketch plan presentation was made showing the subdivision of 143 acres into 27 lots. A sketch plan with all supporting data is to be presented at the next regular meeting.

JOHN HARPER SUBDIVISION

A preliminary sketch of a proposed subdivision was presented by Mr. Harper. The Plan Commission instructed Mr. Harper to prepare all information required by the Subdivision Ordinance and submit same for approval at the next regular meeting.

HOLIDAY HILL FARM SUBDIVISION

A final plat was presented to finalize various land sales between Dr. Kotz and his father. Variance from the requirements of the Subdivision Ordinance was requested under Section 6-8-5. The petitioners were requested to finalize their submittal and present same for consideration at the next regular meeting.

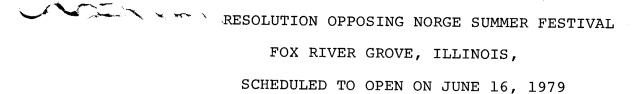
