Minutes of September 24, 1979

The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at 8:00 p.m. at the Village Hall on September 24, 1979. In the absence of President Hansen the President protem, Norman Tucker, called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. Roll Call.

Mr. Tucker asked for approval of the minutes of the regular meeting of August 27, 1979. Mr. Hamill motioned for approval and Mrs. Wellington seconded. Minutes approved.

FINANCE - NORMAN TUCKER

Mr. Tucker reviewed the Treasurer's Report for the first four months. He noted that traffic fines are down and there is a considerable decline in building starts. Mr. Tucker reviewed the 1978 property tax levy figures, and then informed the trustees that revenue sharing income for the coming year should be about \$19,881. Mr. Tucker then asked for approval of the Treasurer's Report. Mr. MacArthur motioned for approval and Mr. Hamill seconded. Motion approved.

Mr. Tucker reviewed the bills presented for approval and asked for a motion to approve \$48,645.44 in bills for payment. Mr. MacArthur motioned for approval. Mr. Hamill seconded. Roll call.

Mr. Tucker briefly reviewed the 1978-79 Audit Report. He asked for a motion that the report be approved and filed. Mr. MacArthur made the motion and Mr. Kempe seconded. Audit Report for fiscal 78-79 approved.

Mr. Tucker reviewed and presented to the trustees a resolution authorizing the First National Bank of Barrington and the First Federal Savings and Loan Association of Barrington to automatically remit to the Village quarterly interest on the savings accounts deposited with those institutions. Mr. MacArthur motioned for passage of this resolution and Mr. Kempe seconded. Roll call.

PLANNING - JONATHAN C. HAMILL

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The sketch plan for Raintree Subdivision was approved by the Plan Commission on September 10, 1979, and recommended planning and engineering changes will be incorporated in the preliminary plat.

The requested variances for Holiday Hills Subdivision were reviewed by the Plan Commission and only one of the five variances was approved. Further consideration is scheduled for the October Plan Commission meeting.

Mr. Hamill noted that the new procedures appear to be working quite well and the developers are cooperative.

Rolling Hills Subdivision Annexation - Mr. Hamill requested passage of an ordinance annexing the territory comprising the Rolling Hills Subdivision to the Village. He motioned for passage and Mrs. Wellington seconded. Roll call.

Ordinance 79-18 passed.

Proposed Soil Overlay Ordinance - Mrs. Larsen noted that this proposed ordinance would be appropriate, and should be included, in Title 6 of the Village Code, Subdivision Ordinance. Mr. Hamill then made a motion requesting that the Plan Commission hold a public hearing on the forthcoming changes at the regular meeting of November 12, 1979. Mrs. Wellington seconded. Motion approved.

Kane County Forest Preserve District/Woodview property - Mr. Hamill noted that he had contacted NIPC requesting details of this proposal, and plans to attend the meeting on October 3, 1979 in Chicago. Mr. Hamill suggested written communication should be made prior to the October 3 meeting so as to dispel any notion that we are in accord. In Mrs. Hansen's absence, Mr. Hamill volunteered to handle the response.

PUBLIC SAFETY - ALEXANDER MAC ARTHUR and CHIEF SCHULD

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False Burglar Alarms - Mr. MacArthur requested that this be put off until such time as he has had an opportunity to gather some statistics and discuss some possible solutions to this problem.

Chief Schuld briefly reviewed the monthly activity report for the trustees.

Communications Grant - Chief Schuld noted that he has a scheduled meeting on Wednesday morning (September 26) with the Barrington and South Barrington Chiefs of Police.

ZONING AND ENFORCEMENT - JAMES A. KEMPE

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Definition Private Stable - Considerable discussion took place between trustees and residents regarding a proposed ordinance defining "private stable" in Section 5-2-1 of the Zoning Regulations. After all persons were heard, Mr. Tucker requested that Mrs. Larsen review and revise the proposed ordinance for presentation at a later date.

Mr. Kempe reported that the Parsons request for a variation was granted.

Definition Interior Lot Lines - The proposed ordinance dealing with lot line definitions in Section 5-2-1 of the Zoning Regularions was discussed. Mr. Hamill motioned for the passage of this ordinance and noted that it had incorporated the recommendations of the Zoning Board. Mr. Kempe seconded. Roll call.

Ordinance 79-19 passed.

Sign Ordinance - Mr. Kempe then reviewed the proposed ordinance designed to clarify the permitted location of signs and revising other regulations in Section 5-5-11 of the Zoning Regulations. Mr. Kempe motioned for passage, and Mr. MacArthur seconded. Roll call.

Ordinance 79-20 passed.

Mr. Kempe then reviewed the Building Department report for August 16 - September 15, 1979. Twelve permits were issued for the following: site development (1), houses (2), house completion (1), additions (2), garages (1), pools (2), stables (2) and driveways (1).

Trustees were informed of a proposed rezoning of 23.5 acres in Cuba Township, Lake County, from Estate (5-ac) to Suburban Residential (less than 1 ac.) which is less than one-half mile from the corporate limits of Barrington Hills. Mr. Hamill will respond in Mrs. Hansen's absence.

ROADS AND BRIDGES - LOUIS J. KLEIN, JR.

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Healy Road - Mr. Sinnett has agreed to service Healy Road as far as plowing is concerned.

Spring Creek Road drainage bids - Some of the specifications have been changed and a report will be forthcoming at our next meeting, according to Mr. Klein.

Mr. Klein then asked for trustee approval of the following: (1) payment of \$1,710.60 to Curran Contracting for 1978 road maintenance work from the general fund; (2) additional \$3,040.12 to Curran Contracting and \$28.53 to Hampton, Lenzini & Renwick for 1977 maintenance from the Motor Fuel Tax Fund. Mr MacArthur motioned for approval and Mr. Hamill seconded. Roll call.

Mr. Tucker then noted that IDOT has informed us that we must now transfer \$39.46 from the Motor Fuel Tax fund back to the corporate fund for the 1972 maintenance program. Mr. MacArthur motioned for approval and Mr. Kempe seconded. Roll call.

LEGISLATION, INSURANCE AND HEALTH - MARJORIE J. WELLINGTON

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Mrs. Wellington noted that the state has now mandated maternity coverage effective October 1, 1979 and asked for board approval of this additional coverage. Mr. MacArthur motioned for approval and Mr. Hamill seconded. Motion approved.

ATTORNEY - WENDY U. LARSEN

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Mrs. Larsen, as requested, presented a proposed ordinance amending vehicle load and weight regulations in Sections 9-2-7-2(c) and 9-2-7-3(c) of the Village Code. Mr. Tucker asked for a motion for approval. Mr. MacArthur motioned for passage and Mrs. Wellington seconded. Roll call.

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Mrs. Barch (115 Bradwell Road) appeared before the Board to request rezoning or disannexation of her 10 acres of property. After some discussion, Mrs. Barch was asked to appear before the Plan Commission for an informal hearing of her request.

HUD Block Grant Program - Mr. Tucker presented a resolution declining participation in the 1980 Urban County Community Block Grant Development Program. Mr. MacArthur motioned for approval and Mr. Hamill seconded. Roll call.

BACOG - Mr. Wilbert Nottke reported that BACOG appears to be the only group moving ahead on the 208 Plan, and the biggest problem seems to be in the area of septic systems.

Route 14 Resolution - A resolution was presented opposing the first phase plans outlined in the Draft Alignment and Feasibility Report for the U.S. Route 14 Study by IDOT, and requesting consideration of alternatives for the improvement of Route 14 to avoid jeopardizing the land use patterns of the Village. Mr. MacArthur motioned for adoption of the resolution and Mr. Hamill seconded. Roll call.

Lake Cook Road extension east of Route 12 - Mr. Tucker reported that he has sent a telegram to George Dunne, President of the Cook County Board, opposing this proposed extension.

There being no further business Mr. Hamill motioned for adjournment and Mr. MacArthur seconded. Mr. Tucker adjourned the meeting at 11:38 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 79 -

AN ORDINANCE ADDING A DEFINITION OF  
"PRIVATE STABLE" TO SECTION 5-2-1 OF THE  
ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

WHEREAS, private stables are permitted by the Zoning Ordinance of the Village of Barrington Hills on five (5) acres as an accessory use in the Residential Districts; and

WHEREAS, the absence of a definition of private stables has created enforcement problems for the Village; and

WHEREAS, notice having been properly given, the Zoning Board of Appeals held public hearings on the issue of stables in the Village on August 23, 1979 and September 17, 1979; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals has submitted findings of fact in accordance with the standards of Section 5-10-7(F) and recommended to the Board of Trustees that a definition of private stables be added to the Zoning Ordinance to clarify the intention of the Village regarding private stables; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills have determined it to be in the best interest of the Village and its citizens to add a definition of private stables to the Zoning Ordinance,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills, Cook, Lake, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois:

SECTION ONE. The definitions contained in Section 5-2-1 of the Village Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding the following definition thereto:

"STABLE, PRIVATE: A "private stable" is a detached building accessory to a residential use, primarily for the keeping of horses owned by members of the immediate family residing on the premises, not offered to the public for hire, and not otherwise operated for profit."

SECTION TWO. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, as required by law.



RESOLUTION NO. 79 - R - 23

RESOLUTION REGARDING  
IMPROVEMENTS TO U. S. ROUTE 14

WHEREAS, the Village of Barrington Hills is a semi-rural residential component of the comprehensive plan of the Barrington Area Council of Governments (BACOG); and

WHEREAS, expansion of existing roads is incompatible with and disruptive to the land use patterns of a semi-rural residential area; and

WHEREAS, the comprehensive plan for the Village of Barrington Hills provides that the residents and Corporate Authorities of the Village of Barrington Hills desire to maintain and enhance the semi-rural characteristics of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities implement those desires through zoning and subdivision ordinances and other governmental activities; and

WHEREAS, existing state highways presently intersect the Village, creating a disproportionate enforcement burden on the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have reviewed the Alignment and Feasibility Report for the Improvements of U. S. Route 14 prepared for the Illinois Department of Transportation, Project No. P-91-827-73 dated August 8, 1979; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities believe it imperative for the Illinois Department of Transportation to consider the desires and concerns of those communities to be effected by their decisions; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize that Route 14 may need to be improved and upgraded over the next few years to accommodate additional population in the area; and

WHEREAS, a system of by-pass routes through the Village of Barrington Hills is inconsistent with the Village's comprehensive plan and implementing ordinances and would increase traffic through the Village to an intolerable level; and

WHEREAS, a four-lane highway along Plum Tree Road is incompatible with accepted land use principles and would be particularly disruptive and offensive to the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, there are transportation alternatives which will not have this destructive and disruptive effect;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills, Cook, Lake, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois as follows:

SECTION ONE: That the Illinois Department of Transportation consider the alternatives for the improvement of Route 14 in the light of the comprehensive plan of the Village of Barrington Hills and take all possible steps to avoid jeopardizing the semi-rural land use patterns of the Village; and

SECTION TWO: That the Village President is directed to take all necessary steps to guarantee that the Illinois Department of Transportation consider the perspective of the Village of Barrington Hills.
