Minutes of October 29, 1979

The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at 8:00 p.m. at the Village Hall on October 29, 1979. President Hansen called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. Roll Call.

Mrs. Hansen asked for approval of the minutes of the regular meeting of September 24, 1979. Mr. Hamill motioned for approval and Mr. Tucker seconded. Minutes approved.

FINANCE - NORMAN TUCKER

Treasurer's Report (5 months) - Mr. Tucker reviewed the report and noted that property tax receipts are about \$38,000 behind the projected budget figures. Mr. Tucker also noted that building permit and traffic fine receipts are also behind budget estimates. Mr. Tucker then asked for approval of the Treasurer's Report and motioned for same. Mr. Klein seconded. Motion approved.

Bills - Mr. Tucker reviewed the list of bills to be approved for payment and motioned for approval in the amount of \$27,526.13. Mr. Hamill seconded. Roll call.

Savings Transfer - Mr. Tucker then recommended that the two savings accounts for \$15,000 each (First National Bank of Barrington and the First Federal Savings & Loan Association of Barrington) be closed out and the funds be placed in the Corporate Account for handling under our normal investment procedures. Mr. Tucker made the motion and Mr. Klein seconded. Roll call.

PLANNING - JONATHAN C. HAMILL

Plan Commission report - Mr. Hamill noted that a public hearing will be held on November 12, 1979 for a discussion on proposed changes to the subdivision ordinance. Arrangements have been made to continue such discussions on November 17 and, if necessary, on November 24 so that recommendations may be ready in time for the Village Board meeting on December 17, 1979.

Kane County Forest Preserve (Woodview) - Mr. Hamill referred to his letter dated September 25, 1979 in which he expressed the concerns of our Village and asked that consideration be given to the preservation of this site as a permanent natural conservation area with no recreational aspects. These same concerns were expressed in person at the hearing held on October 3, 1979. Mr. Hamill expressed the hope that we could develop an intergovernmental agreement to protect our interests, and noted that Mrs. Hansen has been in touch towards this end.

Lake County Cuba Road Rezoning - Mr. Hamill reported that everyone, including BACOG seems to be opposed to this rezoning. He has advised the Lake County Zoning Board that such rezoning is not consistent with our Comprehensive Plan. Mr. Hamill motioned and Mr. Tucker seconded, that the Village Attorney prepare a formal resolution in opposition to this proposed zoning change. Motion approved.

PUBLIC SAFETY - ALEXANDER MacARTHUR

In the absence of Chief Schuld, Sergeant Larry Thoren reviewed the monthly activity report. He noted that the amount of traffic has generally decreased and conditions are somewhat improved due to the fact that motorists are driving slower and more carefully.

A proposed ordinance clarifying Title 9, Chapter 6, Sections 9-6-1 and 9-6-8 of the Code pertaining to vehicle stickers was brought up for discussion. Mr. Klein, with Mr. Kempe seconding, motioned for passage of said ordinance. Roll call.

ZONING AND ENFORCEMENT - JAMES A. KEMPE

ZBA Report - Mr. Kempe reported that both the Hoffman and Lagod petitions for fence variances were granted.

Building Department - Mr. Kempe reviewed the September 16 through October 15 report and noted that 18 permits were issued. 2 homes, 3 additions, 4 septic repairs, 3 pools, 2 garages and 1 each of stables, tennis courts, storage buildings and new roof.

There will be a public hearing before the Zoning Board on November 19 regarding lot widths and agricultural exemption revisions to the Zoning Ordinance.

ROADS AND BRIDGES - LOUIS J. KLEIN, JR.

Mr. Klein reported that Suchy will continue to do Steeplechase Road and Funk will plow McHenry County roads. We have had no word yet from Lake County. ~~the~~^{Cook} County has now given us Healy Road and Sinnett will take over the maintenance starting November 1, 1979.

Hart Road - Vehicles are now traveling over the road according to latest reports. Mr. Klein noted that Lake County will install a guard rail on the north side and we will install something on the berm side. Mr. Klein then noted the proposed ordinance transferring police jurisdiction over Hart Road to the Village of Barrington. Mr. Hamill motioned for passage and Mrs. Wellington seconded. Roll call.

Spring Creek Road repairs - ~~a~~^{the Low} bid for repairs has been accepted from Plote, Inc. and Mr. Tucker motioned for the Village President to be authorized to sign the contract for this work. Mr. Kempe seconded. Roll call.

LEGISLATION, INSURANCE AND HEALTH - MARJORIE J. WELLINGTON

Private Stables - Mrs. Wellington brought up for discussion a proposed ordinance adding a definition of "private stable" to Section 5-2-1 of the Zoning Ordinance. Mrs. Wellington motioned for passage and Mr. Kempe seconded. Roll call.

Cable TV - Mrs. Wellington noted that this has been under review by BACOG for the past 4 or 5 years and suggested we wait to see what happens.

ATTORNEY - WENDY U. LARSEN

Rolling Hills (~~Kemper Park~~) - Mrs. Larsen reported that this is presently being held up due to some difficulty in the Recorder's Office.

Fox River Grove (disannexation request) - Mrs. Larsen noted that there is no petition from the property owners and the county clerk. Also, it appears, according to the letter from the Village of Fox River Grove, that the request would not qualify for disannexation. Mrs. Hansen will respond for the Village.

ADMINISTRATION - BARBARA P. HANSEN

Poplar Creek - Mrs. Hansen noted there is nothing new to report other than the information contained in Marlin Smith's letter dated September 26, 1979.

Hoffman Estates (921 acres) - Mrs. Hansen noted that Don Klein (BACOG) has been asked to attend the meetings on the proposed annexation and rezoning of this property by Hoffman Estates. Mr. Hamill noted that this would be totally contrary to our plans and we must go on record as opposing it. Mr. Hamill suggested action be taken at the November meeting.

Septic Monitoring Program - Mr. Nottke reported that monthly meetings are taking place and that local village ordinances are being reviewed to provide for coverage in all situations in the hope that a more effective ordinance can be devised as a result of this study, and that sludge can be disposed of in a liquid form to the satisfaction of all.

Citizen reports - Mr. Robert Brandt reported hay stacked up and trucks parked on the Suchy property on West County Line Road. The Village will investigate the matter.

A new light is needed at Otis and Brinker Roads. Mrs. Hansen noted that this will be reported to the county.

Stop sign missing at Caesar and Lake Cook Road. The Road Superintendent will replace this sign.

The missing "Barrington Hills" sign at Sutton and Penny is a county matter and the "bridle path" signs will be investigated by the village, according to Mrs. Hansen.

Mr. Tucker suggested the removal of the stop sign on Oak Knoll Road at Old Hart Road.

Mrs. Hansen recessed the public meeting at 9:50 p.m. to go into executive session. The public meeting resumed at 11:25 p.m. and there being no further business, Mrs. Hansen adjourned the meeting at 11:30 p.m.

Attached you will find an accident data sheet of each traffic accident which occurred at the above list intersection during 1978 and 1979. You will find that basically two types of collisions occur:

- #1) a N/B vehicle on Illinois Route 59 collides with a fixed object or another vehicle as it turns from N/B Route 59 to E/B Route 68, or
- #2) a W/B vehicle on Illinois Route 68 collides with a fixed object or another vehicle as it either disobeys the stop sign or fails to yield from the stop sign.

Two general recommendations are made to decrease the accident frequency at this intersection:

- #1) slow down the speed of the vehicle approaching the intersection both Illinois Routes and
- #2) increase the visibility of the stop sign and of north and southbound traffic.

ORDINANCE NO. 79 -22

AN ORDINANCE CLARIFYING
THE REQUIREMENT FOR MOTOR VEHICLE
LICENSES AND THE USE OF THE
FUNDS DERIVED FROM
SUCH LICENSE FEES

WHEREAS, the Village of Barrington Hills requires residents who own or operate motor vehicles within the Village to obtain a motor vehicle license and pay a fee therefor in accordance with the provisions of Ill. Rev. Stat. Ch. 24 §8-11-4; and

WHEREAS, residents of the Village who own or operate motor vehicles may register said vehicles with the State of Illinois to an address within another municipality which may also require motor vehicle licenses; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that it is inequitable to require an owner of a motor vehicle to obtain two licenses and pay duplicate fees therefor;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES of the Village of Barrington Hills, Cook, Lake, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois:

SECTION ONE: Title 9 Chapter 6 Section 9-6-1 be and the same is hereby amended by deleting the said section and adding the following section so that said section shall hereafter read as follows:

"LICENSE REQUIRED: Every motor vehicle registered with the State of Illinois to an address within the corporate limits of the Village of Barrington Hills shall have a motor vehicle license issued annually by the Village of Barrington Hills upon payment of a fee."

SECTION TWO: Title 9 Chapter 6 Section 9-6-8

be and the same is hereby amended by deleting the said section and adding the following section so that the section shall hereafter read as follows:

"USE OF FUNDS: All revenue derived from such license fees shall be used only for the purpose of improving, paving, repairing or maintaining the streets and other public roadways within the Village and for the actual cost of issuing the license plates or stickers, and of collecting and disbursing the fees imposed."

SECTION THREE: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, as required by law.

Re: Stable Regulations

Dear Barbara:

After the discussion at the last Board meeting, I reviewed the issues involved in the further regulation of stables. Enclosed is a definition of private stables which clarifies that livery operations are not permitted in the Village. It emphasizes that private stables are to be accessory to residential uses and permits the Village to enforce all the restrictions applicable to accessory uses in the zoning ordinance. A violation would occur if a stable would be enlarged so that it could no longer be said to be "incidental to" the residential use or "primarily for the use of" the residents. It does not address, however, the issue of boarding horses or the total permitted density of horses because of the concerns expressed by members of the Board, in which I concur.

I suggest, however, that you consider an expansion of the type of horse related activities delineated upon the agricultural exemption such as training and rehabilitation, and specifically exclude livery operations. This expansion should be considered in conjunction with an acreage limitation on the availability of the exemption. Ten acres would be an appropriate minimum because of the relationship to

the favorable tax treatment afforded agricultural uses by state statute (Ill. Rev. Stat. Ch. 120 §501 a-1). I am enclosing a definition for your consideration. The acreage limitation should be included in Section 5-3-4(A).

The definition of private stable can be adopted, if it is acceptable to the Board, without further hearings. The agricultural exemption provision, however, will require an additional public hearing by the Zoning Board of Appeals because it applies to all agricultural uses and not just the breeding and raising of horses. There are one or two items which also need public hearings and if it is acceptable to the Zoning Board of Appeals, they could also be scheduled for the meeting on November 19th, so that the Board can finally consider the issue of stables at the December meeting.

AGRICULTURE: "Agriculture" is the use of land for agricultural purposes, including farming, dairying, pasturage, apiculture, horticulture, floriculture, viticulture and animal and poultry husbandry (including the breeding, raising, training and rehabilitation of horses as an occupation but excluding the offering of horses to the public for hire) and the necessary accessory uses for handling or storing the produce; provided, however, that the operation of any such accessory uses shall be secondary to that of the normal agricultural activities.

RESOLUTION NO. 79 - R-24

RESOLUTION REGARDING PROPOSED REZONING
TO TERRITORY WITHIN LAKE COUNTY ON
CUBA ROAD

WHEREAS, the Village of Barrington Hills is a semi-rural residential component of the comprehensive plan of the Barrington Area Council of Governments (BACOG); and

WHEREAS, the comprehensive plan for the Village of Barrington Hills provides that the residents and corporate authorities of the Village of Barrington Hills desire to maintain and enhance the semi-rural characteristics of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities implement those desires through zoning and subdivision ordinances and other governmental activities within the corporate limits and one and one-half (1 1/2) mile extraterritorial jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Lake County Zoning Board of Appeals conducted a public hearing pursuant to County Zoning Notice No. 2553 on a proposal to amend the Lake County zoning ordinance by changing the classification of certain territory approximately 24 acres in Cuba Township from Estate Zoning to Suburban Residential, changing the lot size from a 5 acre minimum to a 1 acre minimum; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid territory is within the one and one-half (1 1/2) mile extraterritorial jurisdiction of the Village of Barrington Hills; and

WHEREAS, Ill.Rev.Stat. Ch. 34 §3158 requires a favorable vote of three-fourths (3/4) of all the members of the county board if the land affected by an amendment to zoning regulations is within one and one-half (1 1/2) miles of an objecting municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Barrington Hills has appeared before the County Zoning Board of Appeals and expressed concern about the proposed amendment; and

WHEREAS, the proposed change of zoning classification is inconsistent with the comprehensive plan of the Village of Barrington Hills, the predominant 5-acre character of the Village of Barrington, incompatible with other surrounding uses, and will create septic problems;

HOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills, Cook, Lake, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE: That Lake County disapprove the proposed change in zoning classification from 5 acre minimum lot size to a 1 acre minimum lot size for the territory in Cuba Township which is the subject matter of County Zoning Notice No. 2553.

SECTION TWO: That Lake County take all reasonable steps to assure properly functioning systems on all property within the County, including maintaining an existing zoning classification on the aforesaid territory;

SECTION THREE: That Lake County take all reasonable steps including maintaining an existing zoning classification to preserve the integrity of the comprehensive plan of the Village of Barrington Hills.

ORDINANCE NO. 79 - 24

AN ORDINANCE ADDING A DEFINITION OF
"PRIVATE STABLE" TO SECTION 5-2-1 OF THE
ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

WHEREAS, private stables are permitted by the Zoning Ordinance of the Village of Barrington Hills on ~~five (5) acres~~ as an accessory use in the Residential Districts; and

WHEREAS, the absence of a definition of private stables has created enforcement problems for the Village; and

WHEREAS, notice having been properly given, the Zoning Board of Appeals held public hearings on the issue of stables in the Village on August 23, 1979 and September 17, 1979; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals has submitted findings of fact in accordance with the standards of Section 5-10-7(F) and recommended to the Board of Trustees that a definition of private stables be added to the Zoning Ordinance to clarify the intention of the Village regarding private stables; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills have determined it to be in the best interest of the Village and its citizens to add a definition of private stables to the Zoning Ordinance;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills, Cook, Lake, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois:

SECTION ONE: The definitions contained in Section 5-2-1 of the Village Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding the following definition thereto:

"STABLE, PRIVATE: A "private stable" is a detached accessory building for the keeping of horses primarily intended for the use of the residents of the property on which the stable is located and which are not offered to the public for hire."

SECTION TWO: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, as required by law.
