It is my intention to conclude the regular business meeting by 8:00 p.m. and proceed to the discussion of the revised-subdivision regulations and PDO at that time.

Therefore, I would like to ask each of you to carefully read the material in your packets and, particularly, read the "green book" on the subdivision regulations and PDO.

AGENDA ITEMS

Harper subdivision -

Simple two-lot subdivision requiring passage of preliminary plat. No visible problems.

Ross subdivision -

Simple two-lot subdivision requiring passage of the final plat. No problems.

Summer Place -

If there is no positive evidence that an EPA permit has been issued, I will suggest remanding it back to the Plan Commission. We will need to deny the request for waiver.

Village Plant List -

Newly revised plant list for replacement of trees and bushes. Excellent. Passage expected.

Communications Contract -

This contract (with Barrington and South Barrington) has been reworked five or six times. Alex and I are satisfied it protects our use of the new FCC frequency for dispatch. (This contract has nothing to do with dispatch. That will come later.) Barrington and South Barrington have approved in principal. Passage expected.

Minutes of February 25, 1980

The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at 7:00 p.m. on February 25, 1980. President Hansen called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. Roll call.

Mrs. Hansen asked for approval of the minutes of the regular meeting of January 28, 1980. Mr. Tucker motioned for approval and Mrs. Wellington seconded. Motion approved. Mr. Hamill then motioned for approval of the minutes of the special meeting of February 9, 1980 and Mr. MacArthur seconded. Motion approved.

FINANCE - NORMAN TUCKER

Mr. Tucker reviewed the Treasurer's Report for the first nine months of the fiscal year and motioned for approval of same. Mrs. Wellington seconded. Motion approved.

Mr. Tucker then reviewed the list of bills to be approved for payment and motioned for approval in the amount of \$34,007.99. Mr. Kempe seconded. Roll call.

Motion approved.

Mr. Tucker then noted that Northern Illinois Gas Company is requesting reimbursement for utility taxes. He suggested that they be notified this matter is still in litigation. Mrs. Hansen agreed to respond.

Page 2 Minutes of February 25, 1980

Mr. Tucker asked all Trustees to have their budget worksheets for fiscal 80-81 ready for discussion at the next meeting and, hopefully, the new budget will be ready for passage at the April meeting.

PLANNING - JONATHAN C. HAMILL

Mr. Hamill reported that the Plan Commission, at its February meeting, approved the preliminary plat of the Harper subdivision and the final plat of the Ross subdivision, both of which have been referred to the Village Board. Also, the Plan Commission approved a revised Village Plant List.

Ross subdivision - Mr. Hamill read a resolution approving the final plat of this subdivision and motioned for passage. Mr. Tucker seconded. Roll call.

Resolution R-80-3 passed.

<u>Harper subdivision</u> - Part of this is in the Village and part outside. It is expected that annexation will take place prior to acceptance of the final plat. Mr. Hamill motioned for approval of the preliminary plat and Mr. Tucker seconded. Roll call.

Preliminary Plat approved.

<u>Summer Place</u> - Mr. Hamill suggested this go back to the Plan Commission for clarification of the facts and possible waiver of applicability of our subdivision regulations. Concern was expressed about the lack of treatment plant plans and specifications. Mr. Hamill motioned that the Plan Commission be directed to place this on the March 10, 1980 agenda. Mr. MacArthur seconded. Motion approved.

<u>Village Plant List</u> - This is a revised list of available materials suitable to our area which can be furnished to subdividers. Mrs. Wellington motioned for approval and Mr. Tucker seconded. Motion approved.

PUBLIC SAFETY - ALEXANDER MacARTHUR and CHIEF SCHULD

Poplar Creek Music Theater - Mr. MacArthur reported on a meeting with the Illinois State Police, Cook County Sheriff's Department and Barrington Hills Police. He noted that another meeting will be scheduled for the early part of March and he will report at the next meeting.

Chief Schuld briefly reviewed the police activity report for the past month. He then noted that the deadline for purchase of vehicle stickers is February 29, 1980. Persons failing to meet that deadline will be charged \$30. per sticker in accordance with the delinquency provisions of the ordinance.

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Communications Contract with Barrington and South Barrington - This contract, as explained by Mrs. Hansen, has nothing to do with the dispatch contract. It has already been approved, in principle, by the two other villages and guarantees our right to continue use of the new frequency which we receive as part of the grant. Mr. MacArthur motioned for approval of this ordinance and Mr. Kempe seconded. Roll call.

ZONING AND ENFORCEMENT - JAMES A. KEMPE

Mr. Kempe reported that no meeting of the ZBA was held in February. The next meeting is scheduled for March 3, 1980.

Building Department - Mr. Kempe reported two permits issued between January 16 and February 15, 1980; both for new houses.

ROADS AND BRIDGES - LOUIS J. KLEIN, JR.

Mr. Klein had no report this month.

LEGISLATION, INSURANCE AND HEALTH - MARJORIE J. WELLINGTON

Mrs. Wellington had no report this month.

ATTORNEY - WENDY U. LARSEN

Mrs. Larsen reported that March 26, 1980 at 9:30 a.m. oral arguments will be heard on the Poplar Creek Theater suit.

ADMINISTRATION - BARBARA P. HANSEN

Revisions to Subdivision Ordinance (Title 6) and Zoning Ordinance (Title 5) -

Mrs. Hansen reviewed the resolution passed by the Village Board on November 6, 1978 authorizing amendments to the Subdivision and Zoning Ordinances so as to provide standards and procedures for the approval of planned developments. Trustees were referred to the list of joint public hearings held by the Zoning Board of Appeals and the Plan Commission, and the final recommendations of these respective bodies.

Mrs. Hansen then outlined a procedure for discussion and questioning of Village Counsel, Village Engineer and Building and Zoning Enforcement Officer first by the Trustees and then by persons in the audience. This procedure would then be followed by language changes, deletions and/or additions resulting from a general discussion of the revisions to the subdivision ordinance. After considerable discussion, the following changes were brought to a vote on motion of Mr. Tucker and second of Mr. Hamill.

After some discussion, it became apparent that this would take longer, so Mrs. Hansen ruled that if no agreement was reached by midnight, the discussions would be continued at another meeting to be set up prior to the regular meeting of March 24, 1980. Further discussion took place which included recreational areas and homeowners groups, among other things. Mr. Hamill motioned for adjournment and Mr. Klein seconded. Motion approved.

Mrs. Hansen adjourned the meeting at 12:03 a.m.
