



Bristol Renaissance Faire's 20th Year Foole of Surprises

Big, bold and brazenly boisterous, this summer's 20th annual Bristol Renaissance Faire promises patrons an unparalleled celebration, complete with surprise encounters with strolling jesters, jugglers, stilt-walkers and masquerading merrymakers. Bristol's special anniversary "Feast of Fooles" festival begins July 7 for nine weekends through Labor Day, Sept. 3.

"We're going to party like it's 1599," said Linda McFeters, general manager of the Bristol Renaissance Faire.

A new, daily "Royal Spectacle of Fooles" will provide a festive culmination to Oueen Elizabeth's midday parade, long one of Bristol's most cherished traditions. Scores of masked Renaissance characters will mingle with faire-goers for a rousing romp of revelry and song, befitting Her Majesty herself.

For 20 years, the Bristol Renaissance Faire has been captivating visitors with an incomparable spectrum of experiences, from unabashed revelry to first-rate peoplewatching. For those who want to check their inhibitions at the gate, there's ample opportunity to whoop and holler at jousting knights, get down and dirty with raucous, earth-clad mud beggars, or hurl a ripe tomato at a blustering braggart. Those inclined toward more serene pursuits will find a comparable bounty of enjoyments, from watching glass blowers create one-of-a-kind works of art, to joining in a round of 16th-century court dancing, or listening to the dulcet harmonies of world-class singers.

The faire's Kids Kingdom is an enclosed play area filled with oversized sand boxes, a huge climb-aboard pirate ship, and a cast of fable-favorite characters presiding

over a full day of interactive games, crafts and other child-friendly diversions. Each afternoon, during the daily Knighting Ceremony, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth visits the Kingdom to make knights and ladies of all waiting children.

Fourteen entertainment stages feature nonstop music and merriment. Faire favorites Dirk and Guido, "The Swordsmen," perform daring sword fights and compete to win the affections of unsuspecting ladies in the audience. MooNiE the Magnif-Cent masters mind over matter in amazing displays of ropewalking and fire juggling, and the Barely Balanced acrobatic comedy troupe dives through fire, hurls razor sharp knives and balances each other in mind-boggling formations (five weekends only, July 7 to Aug. 5). Among this summer's special musical guests, the explosive Celtic-African fusion group, Tartanic, will appear seven of the Faire's nine weekends. The eight-piece Tartan Terrors band promises to come "dressed to kilt," Aug. and 5th, and the Kaijo Daiko drum ensemble will perform Labor Day weekend, Sept. 1 through 3rd.

Close to 200 artisans display their wares in the Faire Marketplace. Potters, glass blowers, broom caners, and forgers busily go about their work, as shoppers discover rare finds around every corner. Offerings range from sterling silver jewelry and handcrafted leather works to hickory sparring weapons, tapestries, bent willow furniture and wooden marionettes.

Then there's the food! Fresh roasted turkey legs, fish and chips, garlic sauteed mushrooms, corn on the cob, steak sandwiches, savory grilled chicken, ice cream, fruit crepes and other delicacies tempt faire-goers to bring their royal appetites and leave their willpower at home.

Located just west of I-94's Russell Road exit, near Kenosha, Wis., the Bristol Renaissance Faire will open rain or shine, 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., every Saturday and Sunday, July 7 through Sept. 2, and on Labor Day, Sept. 3. 22nd Annual Woodstock Folk Festival Sunday, July 15

The 22nd annual Woodstock Folk Festival will be held on Sunday, July 15 from 12:30 to 6 p.m. on the historic Woodstock Square in Woodstock. The day-long festival will feature a main stage, open mike, children's area, and vocal harmony work-

With a diverse musical lineup that runs the gamut from traditional folk music all the way through alt-country, Americana, blues, bluegrass, contemporary folk and roots music with a little bit of sing-along tossed in for good measure... this longrunning festival truly offers something for everyone. While most of the festival takes place outdoors in Woodstock Square, the Open Mic Stage and harmony workshop will be at the air-conditioned Stage Left Café (next to the Woodstock Opera House on the Square). In case of rain, the festival will be held in the Old Court House Arts Center, also on the Square.

Main Stage performers include:

- Trina Hamlin—Blues inflected folk/pop that grooves! Known for her sizzling blues harmonica and her energy-packed singing and guitar work, her pure voice and unspoiled powerful presence—this is an artist with genuine soul.
- Mark Hobbs—Real music about real life. Hobbs is a Chicago-area singer-songwriter who finds inspiration in the everyday and invites listeners along to see the beauty and interconnectedness in the otherwise seemingly ordinary. Hobbs serves up his songs with a rich, clear, and resonant voice and intricate guitar arrange-
- Jeff and Vida-One of New Orleans' best-known acoustic roots acts. Jeff and Vida perform original material spanning from Appalachian bluegrass to alternative country, showcasing Vida's powerful voice, and Jeff's superb picking on mandolin, guitar and banjo.
- · Lee Murdock-Great Lakes and maritime music spanning 15 generations of musical influence. Murdock has uncover-

ed a boundless body of music and stories about the Great Lakes, finding drama and inspiration in the lives of sailors and fishermen, lighthouse keepers, ghosts, shipwrecks, outlaws and everyday heroes.

Nervous but Excited (Sarah Cleaver and Kate Peterson) is two singersongwriters, two guitars, a mandolin, a violin, a few harmonicas, a barrel of harmony, some vaguely choreographed dancing and lots of laughter. Their original repertoire is fresh, smart and introspective.
- · Amy Speace—An uncanny knack for nailing complex emotions in song with warmth, humor and emotional immediacy. Speace makes music that's both illuminating and effortlessly accessible, offering catchy Americana with indelible hooks, sharply observed lyrics and a gritty urban edge.

During the Festival, the Woodstock Folk Festival Board will present the Sixth Annual Woodstock Folk Festival Lifetime Achievement Award to Jim Post, in recognition of his work as a performer, songwriter and storyteller. Galena-based Post is an Illinois treasure. The Washington Post called Post "a one man tour de force part musical, part drama and thoroughly entertaining." Post has over 20 albums and numerous books, both for children and adults. He does extensive work in the schools and he has produced a revolutionary reading program: a complete musical, phonemic reading readiness curriculum. Those in the Woodstock area (and beyond!) will remember his annual holiday shows at the Woodstock Opera House. This veteran singer has entertained in every musical style: reggae, jazz, rock, folk, rhythm and blues, and marches.

Admission to the all-day Sunday festival is a suggested donation of \$10 for adults, \$20 for families and \$7 for students and seniors. U.S. Supreme Court Decides Pay Discrimination Case by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

Recently, the Supreme Court of the United States considered whether a female employee had an actionable claim of pay discrimination based on gender discrimination under Title VII. The Court considered whether Lilly Ledbetter, a female employee who had worked for Goodyear Tire & Rubber for almost 20 years, had a valid discrimination claim based on the discriminatory pay decisions she had suffered earlier in her career. She alleged that because several supervisors had given her poor evaluations her pay was not increased as much as it would have been throughout the course of her career had comparable male employees. law requires a Charge of Discrimination under Title VII to be filed with the Equal **Employment Opportunity Commission** within a prescribed period of time, the Court considered whether her claims were valid even if some allegations occurred outside the statutory period for filing a discrimination charge.

Arguing that her claims were timely, she claimed that each subsequent paycheck gave present effect to the discriminatory evaluations and therefore also constituted actionable discrimination. The Supreme Court rejected her argument and held that an otherwise nondiscriminatory act does not become discriminatory merely because it might reflect the adverse effects of past discrimination. The decision has been welcomed by employers as a valid interpretation of the statute which requires employees to timely bring claims of discrimination. To the contrary, employee rights advocates argue that the 5-4

decision, authored by Justice Samuel Alito, represents a significant step backward for equal employment opportunity and side with the dissenting opinion of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg who wrote that the majority opinion ignores the realities of the workplace and wage discrimination which makes it difficult for employees to discover unequal pay in the workplace. 
Magic Hour @ Horizon Farms


\$1 Million Gift, New Building Create Excitement at Elgin Academy Graduation

Trying to put Lumineers on normally shaped teeth that have normal contacts between them will make the teeth feel bulkier and will not allow for reshaping and coloring in the areas where the teeth touch one another. The added bulk can also violate the zone that the teeth are meant to be maintained in. If bulk is added to the front of the teeth, the lip will



start pushing the teeth back into the zone. This can create bite problems which can eventually lead into TMJ problems. This is especially true for patients with thin up-

While Cerinate is an excellent company. they are not the only ones that produce porcelain for veneers. The others also make "contact lens thin" veneers. The major concern for the patient should not be the type of porcelain but rather the laboratory that fabricates the veneers. The artistry involved in making a lifelike veneer is extensive. Asking for a specific brand of porcelain will not guarantee a natural and lifelike appearance. If that were true, then all of the artists that bought their painting supplies from the same place that Picasso did, would be world famous.

Facelift Surgery

Most people who are familiar with modern facelifts and other facial cosmetic procedures are aware of their important benefits, in terms of improved appearance as well as self-esteem. However, many people who are good candidates for these procedures may be reluctant to actually have them out of fear of the process itself.

They fear that they might experience pain during the surgery, or that recovery might bring pain or discomfort, or that it might take too long to heal, or that they might find some other aspect of the surgery unacceptable. The following is our interview with W.S. three months following her facelift surgery. · Did you experience any fear before

your surgery?

No, I would say that I had very little fear, if any. I recall having slept totally comfortably the night before. In fact, I had a photograph taken of me when we were leaving for the doctors' office, and I was smiling and looked very relaxed.

· How long did you think about having surgery before going through with it?

I had it on my agenda for about two years. I was looking for a time frame which was much longer than what I ac-

tually needed, and I had to juggle some other things in my life.


 Was the procedure itself painful? No, I didn't feel anything. I really don't recall a thing about it.


· What was your recovery like?

I think that my recovery was phenomenal. I had the surgery on a Tuesday and we had a family party the following Sunday. I will admit that it was in a kind of controlled light, evening situation. But my daughter, who is a young woman, didn't notice anything, so I think that's a pretty good indication. By seven days, I was totally, totally functional. I had a little bit of concern about sleeping in a balanced way. I would sleep on my back. And then, after I slept on my left side, I would try to sleep the same amount on my right side. Other than that, I would say that I had barely any discomfort. I had very little bruising-very, very little bruising. It was a very positive experience, both spiritually and in a more concrete, tangible way.

• Would you go through it again?

In a minute. There is probably not a whole lot that I would do differently, except that I wouldn't tell anybody up front. Because in four or five days, no one would ever know.


