

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS OF THE
VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON, HELD IN SAID VILLAGE JANUARY 11, 1910.

PRESENT: Miles T. Lamey, President, and John C. Plagge and George Hager, being all the members of said Board.

Meeting called to order by President Lamey:

On motion of Mr. Plagge, seconded by Mr. Hager, said motion being carried, Edward F. Kirby, Village Clerk, was appointed Secretary of said Board of Local Improvements.

Mr. Plagge then presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution:


RESOLVED, that William B. Ewing of Chicago, Illinois, be employed as engineer of said Board of Local Improvements, to prepare adequate and complete plans and specifications for a proposed sewerage system in the Village of Barrington, situated in Cook and Lake Counties, and to render such engineering services as may become necessary up to the complete installation of said sewerage system, including the preparation of necessary estimates of cost, plans and specifications for bidders; preparing necessary forms for bidders, and performance of all engineering work in relation to the letting of contracts, and supervising and taking full charge of constructing said sewerage system, including the furnishing of such assistance as may be necessary to expedite said work, excepting inspectors (who are to be appointed by said Board of Local Improvements), upon the understanding that said Ewing shall have as full compensation for said services, a sum equal to Three per cent. of the amount for

which the special assessment or assessments for the installation of said sewerage system shall be confirmed by the courts of Cook and Lake Counties, in which said proceedings shall be had; and in addition thereto, the sum of Fifty (50.00) Dollars for additional surveys necessary to include property not heretofore included in the surveys by said Ewing. Provided, however, that there shall be credited on said amount of compensation the sum of Three Hundred (300) Dollars, heretofore paid said Ewing by the Village of Barrington for services and reports in connection with a sewerage system; and provided, further, that in the event said special assessment for the installation of said sewerage system shall ^{not} be confirmed by the court or courts in which the petitions may be filed, or said Village of Barrington shall for any reason, abandon the proceedings of said special assessments prior to the confirmation by said court or courts, the said Ewing shall be entitled to no compensation whatever, except the said sum of Fifty (50.) Dollars for such additional services, it being understood, that said Ewing as a part of said employment, shall attend court proceedings when necessary, as a witness.

Motion to adopt said Resolution, after being seconded by Mr. Lamey, was carried unanimously.

Mr. Ewing, who was present, accepted the employment on the terms specified.

Pursuant to motion duly seconded the said Board of Local Improvements then adjourned.

Minutes of a meeting of Board of Local Improvements of Village of Barrington held May 16, 1910 at 8 o'clock P.M. Present: Messrs. Lamy and Messrs. Ragg and Hager.

On motion of Mr. Ragg seconded by Mr. Hager Walter Lageschulte was elected Secretary of Board of Local Improvements.

On motion of Mr. Hager seconded by Mr. Ragg the following resolution was adopted.

and that the cost of said improvement, including six per cent of the amount of the assessment to be applied toward the costs and collecting of making such assessment, be paid wholly by special assessment against the property to be benefited thereby.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the estimate of the cost of such improvement (omitting land to be acquired) heretofore made by the President of said Board of Local Improvements, and filed with Secretary of said Board, be and it is hereby approved, the same being attached to and made a part of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 1st day of June, A. D. 1910, at the hour of eight o'clock P. M. be, and it is hereby fixed as the time for the public consideration of the matter of said proposed improvement, said hearing to take place in the Village Hall in said Village of Barrington, and that notice of the time and place of said hearing be given according to law to the persons who paid the general taxes for the year 1909 on each lot, tract or parcel of land, fronting on the proposed improvement.

RESOLUTION FOR OPENING AND EXTENSION OF
APPLEBEE STREET.

WHEREAS in the opinion of the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Barrington, it is desirable and for the best interests of said Village of Barrington that Applebee Street, as now laid out, be extended in a Southeasterly direction from its present Eastern terminus to the West line of Walnut Street, the cost of said improvement to be paid for by special assessment.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by said Board of Local Improvements that it is the sense of said Board that said Applebee Street in the Village of Barrington be extended from its present Eastern terminus to the West line of said Walnut Street in said Village of Barrington, and that for that purpose there shall be taken by condemnation proceedings the following described real estate, to wit:

Commencing at the point where the Southerly line of Applebee Street intersects the West line of Lot one (1) in County Clerk's Division of unsubdivided lands in the South West quarter of Section thirty-six (36), Township forty-three (43) North, Range nine (9), East of the Third Principal Meridian; thence in a straight line in a Southeasterly direction to a point on the West line of Lot two (2) in Richardson's Subdivision in the South West quarter of Section thirty-six (36), Township forty-three (43) North, Range nine (9), East of the Third Principal Meridian distant 39 and 8/10 feet South of the Southerly line of the right of way of the Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company; thence Southeasterly on a line parallel with and distant at right angles thirty-three (33) feet from said Southerly line of said right of way to the
