Second Resolution.

WHEREAS A public hearing was held by this Board of Local Improvements of Barrington, Cook and Lake Counties, Illinois, On April 1st, 1930, to consider and hear the representations of all persons interested on the subject of the necessity for the proposed improvements and the nature thereof, or the cost as estimated, for the construction of a local improvement, as follows, to-wit:

That Cook Street from the Northerly line extended of Franklin Street (between Cook Street and Hough Street) to a line one hundred and twenty-five (125) feet South of and parallel with the Southerly line of Station Street; Franklin Street from the Easterly line extended of Hough Street to the Westerly line extended of Cook Street; Main Street from a line one hundred and thirty-eight (138) feet West of and parallel with the Westerly line of Hough Street (South of Main Street) to a line one hundred and thirty two (132) feet East of and parallel with the Easterly line of Elm Street; Hough Street from the Northerly line extended of Franklin to the Southerly line extended of Station Street; Station Street from a line two hundred (200) feet West of and parallel with the Westerly line of Hough Street to the Westerly line ~~of Hough Street~~ ~~to the Westerly line extended~~ of Grove Avenue; Park Avenue from the Northerly line extended of Station Street to the Southerly line extended of Main Street; and Railroad Street from the Easterly line extended of Cook Street to the Northerly line extended of Main Street, be improved by constructing under and along said streets and avenues an Ornamental Electric Street Lighting System consisting of forty-nine ornamental lighting standards, fifteen (15) feet to the light center, fitted with glass fixture and canopy and six hundred (600)

candle power lamps and nine ornamental lighting standards, twelve (12) feet and six(6) inches to the light center, fitted with glass fixture and canopy and two hundred and fifty(250) candle power lamps, all lamps to be 606 ampere primary series burning type C, and also an Outdoor Distribution Station, consisting of wood framework (two forty-five foot wood poles having a ten(10) inch butt thickness), necessary disconnects, fuses, meters, lightning arrestors, constant current, regulating transformer, all mounted on a wood platform erected between aforesaid wood poles, and also including all cable, potheads, service, conduits, handholes, and other appurtenances, necessary for a complete, workmanlike lighting system, complete in place and ready for operation, all in the aforesaid Village and all as described in the Resolution passed by this Board on March 17 1930, And the Estimate of the Cost of said improvement approved in said Resolution and attached thereto and made a part thereof, and as shown on the plans attached to said Resolution, pursuant to notice mailed, as required by law, and upon due proof made to this Board, this Board finds that notices were given and mailed of said public hearing, as required by law, and

WHEREAS, this Board at said hearing has heard the representations of all persons interested in said improvement who desired to be heard on the subject of the necessity for the proposed improvement and the nature thereof or the cost as estimated, and has considered said representations,; and it appearing to this Board that said First Resolution, as originally adopted, should be modified as follows;

- a, by omitting the metal standards;
- b, by eliminating the Outdoor Distribution Station as provided for in the aforesaid First Resolution and by providing for an underground service station consisting of a concrete manhole to house the transformer and all necessary power service appurtenances;
- c, by providing for another type of Lighting Unit hereinafter designated as "Type B Lighting Unit" as an alternative to the "Type A Lighting Unit" provided for on the concrete standards in the aforesaid First Resolution.
- d, by changing the location of standards to conform with the locations shown on the attached plan.
- e, by constructing the cable with a No. 6 Browne and Sharpe gauge copper wire conductor, instead of No. 8 as specified in the First Resolution.
- f, by making such changes in design, plans, drawings, and estimates, as are made necessary by the foregoing changes and modifications.

Gentlemen:

The Board of Local Improvements of the aforesaid Village having adopted a First Resolution, held a public hearing thereof, and adopted a Second Resolution modifying and adhering to the proposed improvement as modified, namely;

That Cook Street from the center line extended of Franklin Street (as located between Cook Street and Ela Street to a line one hundred and twenty-five (125) feet South of and parallel with the Southerly line extended of Station Street; Frankling Street from the Easterly line extended of Hough Street to the Westerly line extended of Cook Street; Main Street from a line one hundred sixty-seven (167) feet West of and parallel with the Westerly line of Hough Street (South of Main Street) to a line thirty-five (35) feet Westerly of and parallel with the Westerly line of Spring Street; Hough Street from a line thirty (30) feet Northerly of and parallel with the Northerly line extended of Franklin Street to a line thirty (30) feet Southerly of and parallel with the Southerly line extended of Station Street; Station Street from a line thirty (30) feet West of and parallel with the Westerly line of Hough Street to the Westerly line extended of Grove Avenue; Park Avenue from the Northerly line extended of Station Street to the Southerly line extended of Main Street; and Railroad Street from the Easterly line extended of Cook Street to the Northerly line extended of Main Street, be improved by constructing under and along said streets and avenues an Ornamental Electric Street Lighting System, consisting of concrete standards and lighting fixtures, cable, handholes, iron pipe conduit, and a concrete service manhole including therein a transformer, potheads, automatic time switch, cable, and all other necessary appurtenances, complete in place and ready for operation, including all labor and material, all in the aforesaid Village, we herewith submit a draft of an ORDINANCE for said improvement, together with an Estimate of the cost of said proposed improvement, as finally determined by this Board and we recommend the passage of the said Ordinance and the making of the improvement described therein.




