Village Board ^{met} in regular session with Earl Hatje presiding as President and Arthur C. Burandt as Clerk and the following members present;

Motion was made by Trustee Wewetzer and seconded by Trustee Sutfin, that the minutes of the meeting of August 4th, 1941 be approved and accepted as received by the Trustees. Motion carried.

Following parties appeared at Village Hall to talk over widening of N. Hough Street.

Mr. Schiller, representing Consoer, Townsend & Quinlan, Village Engineers.

Mr. C. H. Apple, District Engineer, representing State Highway Dept.

Mr. H. D. Kelsey, State Representative.

After all men spoke about the project and all ~~angles~~ points were debated, it was moved by Trustee Kocher and seconded by Trustee Blanke that a Resolution be drawn up requesting the State Highway Dept. to widen North Hough Street to correspond with South Hough Street and install curbing.

Village of Barrington is to pay the cost of installing drainage and the Highway Dept. will pay the cost of widening and curbing.

Motion carried.

Mayor Hatje agreed to see Village Attorney to see that the proper resolution be drawn up and forwarded to the State Highway Dept.

Representative Kelsey agreed to help with the Project and if the Board so desired, he would make arrangements to go to Springfield, Illinois with a committee from the Village Board and put the project before the Chief Engineer and help to get the approval of the State.

Mr. Schiller, representing Village Engineers, was instructed to have the Engineers prepare the proper resolution, requesting the State Highway Dept. to allow the Village of Barrington to repair and improve the step in the Sidewalk, on East Main Street, between Elm Street and Railroad Street, on the North side of Main Street, and to repair the pavement that has settled on W Lake Street. This work is to be done immediately and will be paid for with Gas Tax Money.

Sewer or Bldg. Committee will meet with Mrs. Jane Keeler ~~for~~ Thursday night to discuss her problem, before legal action is taken. Mrs. Keeler is violating the Zoning Ordinance by remodeling her home into a three family or four family dwelling. This section is zoned for two family dwellings.

Mr. Etters request to have the ^{committee} Village of Barrington connect the 6 inch drain tile on E. Lincoln Ave. to the Sanitary Sewers on South Hough Street, was referred to bring in a report on what assessments this particular lot paid, if any for sewers and all other information, so that the Village Board would be able to pass upon the request fairly. Above motion was made by Trustee Wewetzer and seconded by Trustee Berg. Motion carried.

Entire Village Board concurred in the recommendation of the Police Committee, and allowed Officer Reynold Smith one weeks vacation with pay this year.

The question of an increase in pay for the Police Officers and other men on the Village Pay Roll, was carried over until the next regular meeting, in order to give the committee time to make a check with Village Treasurer, to find out how each Fund is fixed ~~financially~~ financially and if money will be available to pay the increase in pay.

The question of requesting additional white crushed stone for RR driveway, was referred to Street Committee to handle.

Village Board discussed the possibility of changing all Street names , South of Hillside Ave. to correspond with the Streets North of Hillside Ave. For instance, Streets North of Hillside are called Grove Ave., Cook Street Division Street, and Prairie Ave . and South of Hillside Ave. the Streets are named, First, Second, Third and Fourth Ave.

Clerk was instructed to publish a notice for a Public Hearing on changing the names, and if there are any objections, the property owners, can appear at this hearing and file their objections.

Fire Chief advised Village Board that the Pirsch Fire Truck was being repainted and that the entire job, of repairing Truck and painting it, will not exceed \$300.00.

Special Assessments etc. on Lot of Earl Etters, East Lincoln Street

Lot is west 42 feet of Lot No. 5 and west 42 feet of Lot No. 6
in Block 4 bounded by S. Hough, S. Cook and E. Lincoln and
E. Russell Streets.

This lot is 42 feet wide by 72 feet deep, giving 3,024 square feet
No. 8 special
the sewer assessments paid and due on this lot amounted to \$64.19.

no sanitary municipal sewer was installed in Lincoln St. between S.
Hough and S. Cook Streets by the village. If a sewer had been
installed, it would have been of 8-inch diameter.

the special assessment paid by the lot was an indirect assessment
plus assessment for the sewage disposal plant.

To provide a sanitary sewer connection for this lot, the owner in-
stalled 150 linear feet of 6-inch sewer tile in addition to the
connection which would have been required for him to connect at the
center of Lincoln St.; he made this 150 feet of extension to what was
at that time the combined storm and sanitary sewer in the centerline
of South Hough Street.

Estimating the installation of the additional sewer at \$1.00 per
foot, or \$150.00 total, the lot paid \$150.00 plus \$64.19, or a total
of \$214.19 toward the No. 8 special sewer assessment installation.

As a matter of comparison, the Gleason lot on Lincoln St., about one
block east of the lot in question, paid \$192.75 on the No. 8 special
assessment; and it received the benefit of an 8-inch sanitary sewer
in the center of Lincoln St. This lot is about 66 feet wide by 132
feet in depth, giving 8,712 square feet. This lot area is 3 times
the lot area of the lot in question and paid 3 times as ~~much~~ almost
much; but got a sewer for it.

In the year 1936 when the village of Barrington rebuilt its sewer
system, the combined storm and sanitary sewer in S. Hough Street was
changed to a storm sewer; and a new sanitary sewer was laid in the
sidewalk line on the west side of S. Hough St. All houses which were
at that time connected to the combined sewer, were connected over to
the new sanitary sewer by the Village at its expense, at the rate of
\$15.00 per connection plus cost of tile, cost of sand backfill, cost
of tunneling and incidentals. It is now estimated that the cost of
connecting over amounted to about \$90.00 for a connection.

In the present case the cost of connecting over the sewer service line
to the sanitary sewer on the west side of S. Hough St., from the storm
sewer in the center of S. Hough St., is estimated to cost between \$90.
and \$100.00. In view of the above outlined conditions in the case,

the undersigned members of the sewer committee recommend to the village
that the Village of Barrington make the necessary changes in the sewer
service and pay for the cost of same.

To the Board of Trustees, Village of Barrington.

On August 5, 1941, the building committee of the village board, on orders from the board of trustees in session on August 4, 1941, instructed the building commissioner to mail Mrs. A. E. Keeler at East Russell Street a 15-day notice stipulating that she must restore her building as altered in the year 1941, to comply with the zoning requirements.

On August 18 Mrs. Keeler asked the president and the building committee of the board of trustees to meet with her on the evening of Thursday, August 21 at the Village Hall. The building committee agreed to meet with her, stipulating that such meeting would not affect the term of the 15-day notice expiring on Friday, August 22.

At the meeting there appeared Mr. Kocher, Mr. Sutfin and Mr. Blanke, for the Village, and Mrs. Keeler, Mrs. Jahnke, her friend, and Mr. Bardwell, her attorney. The question of violation of the zoning ordinance was discussed thoroughly and analyzed from every angle. As a result of this discussion Mrs. Keeler and her attorney agreed with the building committee of the Village Board that she would eliminate the fourth apartment within 30 days, by removal of the kitchen sink and other features making it an apartment. Mrs. Keeler explained to the building committee that she was not aware of the zoning requirements when she arranged the additional apartment.

The building committee decided to give Mrs. Keeler until Oct. 1 to comply with the zoning ordinance.

The building committee learned that a Mr. Gumbracht from Crystal Lake did the plumbing work in the apartment. According to available records he had no bond permitting him to do ~~pl~~ plumbing in the Village of Barrington. The building committee intends to go the very limit of the law in prosecuting said party for violation of village ordinances; but will be guided by the outcome of the Keeler case.

Entire Village Board approved the installation of a New Street Light on South Grove Ave., near Dr. Fannings Home. Committee will work with Mr. Schreiber and give their report to the Village Clerk, so that the proper resolution can be prepared and sent to the Public Service Company.

Trustee Sutfin's report to place of charge of \$5.00 on all contractors when building new homes, ~~was referred to Water Committee~~ for the use of water, while building, was referred to Water Committee for checking.

Entire Village Board ruled that PIN BALL machines are not permitted to be operated in the Village of Barrington, and the Police were instructed to see to it that all machines are cleaned out of Barrington.

Trustee Sutfin recommended the following changes be made for Closing Hours for all Taverns operated in the Village of Barrington. Weekdays, change from I A.M. to II P.M. and Saturdays " " 2 A.M. to 12 Midnight.

Quite a discussion followed and it was moved by Trustee Berg and seconded by Trustee Kocher that the hours for closing all Taverns, remain the same as printed in the Village Ordinance, and that no changes be recommended. Motion as follows; Ayes; Kocher, Berg, Wewetzer, Owens (4) Sutfin; Naves, (1).

Mrs. George Benson and her Son appeared before the Village Board to what help she could secure from the Village Board to allow her to operate her Business, as a second Hand Dealer in Cars & as a dealer in selling second hand parts of cars they wrecked.

She advised Village Board that she had received a final 30 day notice to discontinue her business in this particular section of Barrington, as this property was zoned for single family residences only and not for business.

Mrs. Benson was instructed to present the Village Board with a petition, asking that her property be re-zoned from Single Family Residence to Business Property zoning. Petition will be presented to the Village Board in the near future. No further action was taken on the final 30 day notice.

Mr. V. H. Schroeder appeared before the Village Board to find out if the Village would grant the Company, he represented a Special permit to rent the old Gold Star Motor Company Warehouse on Station Street for Light Manufacturing. The Company makes Bowling Alley Pins. Mr. Schroeder was instructed to present the Village Board with a petition, signed by the property owners within a half block near this Bldg, that they do not object to the Company using this property for this purpose, and Village Board will then pass on the petition.

Mr. Fred Beinhoff's request to the Village Board, asking them to help pay for about one half of the cost of installing a cement walk at 141 N Hager Ave. was referred to Street Committee. No action was taken by the Village Board.

Entire Village Board concurred in the recommendation of the Fire Committee, and instructed the Fire Chief to purchase a new Magneto for the Village Fire Truck. Cost will be about \$24.98.

Motion was made by Trustee Kocher and seconded by Trustee Berg that the letter from George Consoer, regarding the handling of the Main Street and W Lake Street jobs, be referred to Street Committee with power to act. Motion carried.

Mr. Fred Hagers letter, regarding the condition of the Burner at the Bisposal Plant was referred to Sewer Committee with Power to act, in rectifying the condition of the Gas Burner and the Pilot light in the Boiler.

Committee will meet with Mr. Hager at the Plant Tuesday night at 6.30 P.M. to make a check on conditions.

After a little disccussion, it was decided to turn the entire matter over to Zoning Board of Appeals, Village Board and make a study of NW Highway Property and make their report.

Village Board felt that this property could be rezoned for Business Purposes, but did not feel as ththrough they wished to allow a Junking Business to continue.

George Etters, was advised that he would be granted a permit to remodel the old Robertson Home and Garage, if he purchased the property.

A special meeting will be held Monday Evening October 20, 1941 at 7.30 P.M. between the Zoning Board of Appeals and the Village Board to talk over various cases and conditions.

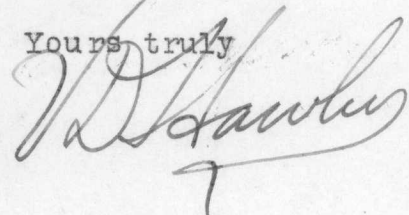

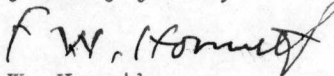

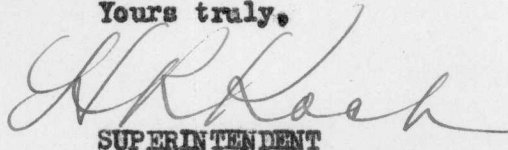
