Motion was made by Trustee Owens and seconded by Trustee Wewetzer that the Sewer Committee be authorized to sell the old scrap iron pipe to James B. Clow & Sons at their bid of \$13.50 per ton. Motion carried.

The question of installing an expansion Tank on the Boiler at the Disposal Plant, was carried over until the next regular meeting, as Committee was still seeking some more information on the project.

The question of installing air vents and fans to remove the sewer gas from the lower floors at the Disposal Plant, as explained by Trustee Blanke, was carried over until Village Engineers made a check on the installation and present their report/
Cost of installing the vents was estimated as \$75.00.

Motion was made by Trustee Blanke and seconded by Trustee Kocher that the Membership dues for the boys at the Disposal Plant in the Central State Sewage Works Association, be allowed and ordered paid. Membership dues amounts to \$3.00 per year. Motion carried.

Mr. James R. Murphy appeared before the Village Council and asked for a refund on all sewer rental charges that he has paid to the Village of Barrington since 1936, due to the fact that he is not connected to the Barrington Sewers, and never has been. Mr. Murphy has paid the Village of Barrington \$79.63 in sewer rental charges to date.

Motion was made by Trustee Wewetzer and seconded by Trustee Owens that a refund be made to Mr. Murphy for all sewer charges he has made to date. Motion as follows;

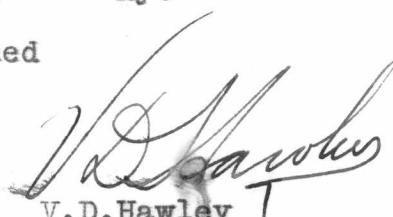
