Minutes to Meeting on January 2, 1992

The meeting was called to order by Commander Ray Tourville at 7 PM. Seven members were present: Ray Tourville, Bob Brandt, Lou Vonau, Max Hembre, Dan Capulla, Tom Plagher and Earl Billman.

Minutes of the previous meeting on December 5, 1991, were read by Comander Ray Tourville and were unanimously accepted after a motion by Lou Vonau and a second by Earl Billman.

The Financial Report was furnished by Max Hembre. A motion to accept by Earl Billman and a second by Lou Vonau was unanimously agreed.

The December 10 Elgin Hospital Party received a most positive report by Commander Ray Tourville. A discussion regarding future hospital parties followed. Commander Ray Tourville will seek future dates for these parties with the intent of changing the dates from April and December to April and September, or thereabouts.

A new-member application from Dick Comerford was presented for membership. A motion by Max Hembre, a second by Earl Billman, and an unanimous vote by the members in attendance accepted the applicant.

Sick call reported 2 members ill: Ray Novak being in Good Shepherd Hospital after suffering a stroke, and Mel Purinton entering the hospital due to heart problems.

A report of restaurants for the Birthday Dinner scheduled for March 15 was given by Dan Capulla and Earl Billman. The list included The Barn, Brigantes, Fritzls, John Evans and Hob Nob. A motion by Lou Vonau, a second by Dan Capulla, and a unanimous vote chose Fritzls as the site. A motion to follow the same procedures as in the past for the Post to underwrite the cost of dinners for paid-up post members, past Lady Auxiliary members and American Legion Boosters was made by Lou Vonau, seconded by Dan Capulla, and unanimously agreed. Music for the affair was delegated to Commander Ray Tourville by motion of Lou Vonau, a second by Dan Capulla.

A motion by Earl Billman that each person making reservations and being in attendance at the dinner will receive an Illinois Lottery Ticket as a gift from the Post. This motion was seconded by Dan Capulla and unanimously accepted.

Dan Capulla reported that Village President Forsberg suggested that the Post furnish flags for the village streets and plan a parade in honor of Flag Day. The issue was tabled and may be discussed later. Max Hembre discussed the possibility of the Post sponsoring a luncheon for members of the Barrington Area Council on Aging. A motion by Bob Brandt, a second by Lou Vonau, and an unanimous vote decided that Max could chair this activity and is authorized to spend up to \$400 for the cost of meals, table center pieces of red and white carnations and an American flag, other room decorations and door prizes. This luncheon is to be held on Friday, June 12, at Lagendorf Park Field House.

This meeting was adjourned by Commander Ray Tourville at 8:30 PM.

Max Hembrey reported on the continuing plans for our Post 158 golf tournament to be held on June 1. We will need active help from all available legionnaires to make this important fund raising event a success.

The matter of a roster phone list was discussed and the Adjutant will continue to develop.


Earl Billman suggested the following resolution in an effort to increase active participation by members at our 1st Thursday business meetings:

A financial report was presented by Max Hembrey and approved. Max also presented a preliminary financial report on our golf outing which cleared about \$9,000 for use in supporting our Legion Baseball Program for 1992.

Bob Brandt reported we now have 174 members which will be close to final for the 1991/92 year.

The Poppy Day sale was very successful with \$946 taken in -- about \$300 more than last year.

The Memorial Day Parade and ceremonies were an outstanding success with 14 Legionnaires taking part. Unfortunately the car signs did not arrive for use in this event.

Our Boys' State program has been finalized with 2 boys representing our Post. \$150 has been paid for each boy's expenses including transportation.

Plans for the Flag Day luncheon for senior citizens at Langendorf Park are set. We expect about 90 to attend and six Legionnaires volunteered to help out with the activity.

The "Flags on Main Street" plan seems to be moribund at this point due to lack of interest by village personnel.

Our third annual golf outing was another big success with 94 participating in golf and 102 for dinner. We cleared about \$1,000 more than last year which will help support our summer baseball program.

The Legion summer baseball program will start June 5. Our Post will contribute between \$5,000 to \$10,000 depending on how far the team goes in the tournaments.

The North Chicago VA Hospital party had been planned for July 8th. However, we have received various requests for other types of assistance so the July 8th date is hereby cancelled. Dan Capulli and Earl Billman have volunteered to establish a specific contact at the hospital to coordinate the various requests and will report back at our next meeting.

A good deal of discussion was held on the proposed Elgin Hospital party for the fall. Lou Vonau and Earl Billman agreed to investigate alternatives to the party and report back.

No action was taken regarding plots for wives in the Legion's plots at Evergreen cemetery due to the absence of Burt Wendt.

School Awards were presented at St. Anne (2) and Middle School (4) will be presented June 5. Earl Billman represented the Legion at these ceremonies.

The Car Show Trophy in the name of the Legion and our Post is arranged for the Barrington Historical Society event in July.

Ray Tourville presented our Legion Scholarship Award on May 26 at Barrington High School. The recipient this year of \$500 was Holly Sherwood. She will attend Carthage College this fall.

Following a lengthy discussion, it was agreed we will try to generate greater attendance and interest by member Legionnaires via a newsletter. Earl Billman presented a sample which with minor revisions was approved. Several members agreed to help out with the folding, stuffing, stamping and addressing work.

The final point of business was agreement that the installation of new Post officers will take place at our next dinner meeting on July 16.

The meeting adjourned at 8:45 P.M.
