The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Barrington Hills was held at 8 PM Monday evening, November 17th, 1958, at the Country-side School, Brinker and County Line Roads. At. Mr. Dallstream's request, Mr. Canby reported on the status of the proposed Lake County annexation. On November 13, Judge Hultz of Lake County entered a final order referring to the corporate authorities of the village for final action the question of annexation of certain territory in Lake County. Thereupon, attorney for three

property owners within that area handed Mr. Canby notice of appeal of the control of them objections to annual for withdrawal from Barrington Hills. Mr. Canby advised the Trustees of the necessity of deciding whether or not the village will fight

said appeal for withdrawal. After discussion, the Board deferred the matter to the December meeting.

Mr. Goltra, chairman of the Finance Committee had no report.

Mr. Caesar, chairman of the Committee for Roads and Highways, advised the Trustees that he and Mr. Olson will submit information on the motor fuel tax usage at the next meeting.

Mr. Olson, reported that he has applications for building permits pending for four new homes and for one addition, the total valuation of which will come to slightly over \$200,000. Mr. Olson then presented the following bills for read repair and maintenance for approval by the Board:

These stickers will then be mailed to the residents of the village. Mr. Stresen-Reuter then brought up the matter of speed control on roads in the village. After discussion, the Board asked that an ordinance for highway speed and weight control be drafted for presentation at the next meeting. Mr. Stresen-Reuter reported on a survey made by the State Highway Department for Brinker Road. He advised the Board that he has requested similar surveys for certain areas on Routes 59 and 63, to help the village determine what speed limits would be advisable.

The Board discussed the Road Specifications Ordinance for subdivisions, and again deferred action on this ordinance to the next meeting.
