Grades in the Basement? Don't Go Through the Roof!

Your child brings home another report card with grades that are aimed at sending you through the roof. The teacher's comments leave little room for doubt that a problem exists: "Not prepared," "Not working up to potential," "The class clown," or quite simply, "Lazy." What's a parent to do?

According to Dr. Raymond Huntington, founder and president of Huntington Learning Centers, "It is far easier to blame the school, the child or yourself than it is to come up with concrete solutions. However, if solutions are not found, the problem will snowball.

He adds, "In order to succeed, four basic ingredients are necessary: intelligence, skills, confidence and motivation. Almost every child we work with at The Huntington Learning Center has the intelligence to do the job expected, but lacks skills, confidence or motivation."

How to Choose a Dance School for Your Child

Many parents of young children who desire to take dance lessons find themselves unsure as to how to choose a school. Frankly, a recommendation from a neighbor or friend is not enough. You should always visit the school in person. The following are some guidelines as to how to choose a school in order to insure your child's proper instruction and personal safety.

Facility-The dancers should have a large room with a special sprung floor. Dancing on concrete covered with tile or other hard surfaces is dangerous. There should be ample mirrors and well-constructed ballet barres for older students.

Observation of Classes-Before enrolling in any school, you should make an appointment to observe a class. Even if you are not knowledgeable, you will be able to judge certain critical things.

1) Is the teacher well organized and pleasant?

2) Is he/she knowledgeable? (Check the school brochure for teachers' backgrounds.)

3) Are the teacher's corrections made clearly and in a positive way?

4) Are the students well behaved and attentive for their age?

Performing Opportunities—As dance is a performing art, it is imperative that the students get the chance to dance for an audience. However, a good school should stress education and not detract from that for the sake of performing. A fancy costume will never cover up poor dancing!

Tuition-Do some comparison shopping as to class rates. Classes should be competitively priced but one should not think that the cheapest class means more for your money. As with everything, quality costs more. Schools should have discounted tuition for multiple classes if your child is a serious student. Family discounts may also be available.

Even pre-schoolers taking lessons should have a fun, interesting and beneficial class. A little extra time will result in a decision that you and your child will be happy with for years to come!







Family Limited Partnerships: Are They For You? by Sharon L. Keller, J.D., LLM

Happy spring to all my readers!! I hope all of you take time to enjoy the beauty that surrounds us. 1998 has been a very busy year to date. The booming stock market of 1997 and 1998 has caused people to assess their economic position and take advantage of the unplanned increase in their portfolios. One of the most asked questions this year has been whether or not a Family Limited Partnership is a tool that would meet their needs. As a result of the numerous requests for information concerning Family Limited Partnerships (FLPs), I felt that this month would be a good time to share some of the special problems and benefits associated with conduct of family businesses as partnerships.

Essentially, an FLP is a partnership that is organized with two types of interests, general partnership interests and limited partnership interests. General partnership interests will be entitled to control partnership decisions and to elect the managing partners. The managing partners determine the partnership distributions. The general partners decide whether to liquidate the partnership, sell assets or merge the partnership with another entity.

The limited partners receive distributions from the partnership when they are made. The majority of the equity is held by the limited partners. For example, 95% limited partnership interests. The minority of the equity is represented by the family members. In most FLP's, the objecgeneral partnership interest.

When developing estate plans, many
