

MINUTES OF MEETING OF PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON
HELD MONDAY, MARCH 9, 1964

Meeting called to order by President John H.D. Blanke. At roll call Trustees present: David R. Capulli, Robert J. Long, Paul J. Shultz, Frank J. Wyatt; Also present: Mabel M. Schaede, Clerk Pro Tem, B. J. Zelsdorf, Treasurer, and S. Axelrood, Attorney.

INVOCATION by Rev. Robert D. Gerhard, St. Michael's Episcopal Church.

President Blanke reported Mrs. Pinkerman, Clerk, being absent for several days. Motion by Trustee Capulli appointing Mabel M. Schaede, Clerk Pro Tem, seconded by Trustee Shultz. Ayes.

MINUTES OF 2/24/64 Motion by Trustee Long that Minutes be approved as submitted. Second by Trustee Wyatt. Ayes.

INQUIRIES FROM AUDIENCE INVITED: No response.

MENTAL HEALTH SOCIETY OF GREATER CHICAGO Reference made to their letter dated March 6, 1964 relating to United Drive membership. (President Blanke to write letter).

VILLAGE TREASURER'S REPORT - February 1964 Received and placed of record.

LIST OF BILLS - March 9, 1964 Trustee Long stated list of bills routine; Ahrens & Condill bill for Weil pump, for Village Hall, an emergency; with respect to Atty. Matthews' charge of \$50.00 in the Kerrigan/Lewis matter, inquiry was directed to Atty. Axelrood as to the nature of this. Information was furnished that they had appeared in court several times on this matter and that at the last appearance the Judge stated there will be no next time and that final order will be entered in April one way or the other; that the matter will be resolved in April. President Blanke stated that any bills submitted by the Attorney will, in turn, be forwarded to the Engineers for payment; that with respect to the VanGiesen charge of \$28.00 this involved police duty at the Barco Mfg. plant; that it is proper for the Village to pay the officer, and that the Village has been reimbursed. Trustee Long stated that the Street Fund and Water Fund each bear one-half of the cost of the RCA radio. Motion by Trustee Long that all bills be paid. Second by Trustee Capulli. ROLL CALL - Ayes: Capulli, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

AMERICAN LEGION BIRTHDAY WEEK - March 15-22. Proclamation on file with the Clerk.

VILLAGE OWNED LAND - Bids on sale of. Notice of bids properly published; one bid on hand. Pertains to certain property in Walnut Grove Subdivision. Bid of Commonwealth Edison Company, dated February 28, 1964, read. During discussion Trustee Long emphasized the importance that bid be checked carefully as to real estate description before written acceptance is given. Motion by Trustee Long that bid be accepted and that the

Attorney be directed to prepare deed transmitting title to Commonwealth Edison Company and Ordinance to carry out conveyance of title. (further discussion) Second by Trustee Wyatt. ROLL CALL - Ayes: Capulli, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

IMPROVEMENT OF DUNDEE AVE. AND OTHER STREETS BY MFT. Letter of Consoer Townsend & Associates, dated March 9, 1964, read. Mr. Engler was asked to comment on same and suggested that the County Supt. of Highways be contacted, and that the Village make such contact. After further discussion Motion by Trustee Wyatt that Consoer Townsend & Associates be authorized to proceed with improvements set forth in letter dated March 9, 1964 in connection with the 1964 Motor Fuel Tax program. Second by Trustee Long. ROLL CALL - Ayes: Capulli, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

POOL HALL ORDINANCE - amended age limit. Information furnished of no change in Ordinance. Pool hall vacated as of February 29th.

PERMIT TO MOVE RESIDENCE FROM GROVE AVE. TO SUMMIT STREET. House is 27' x 30', weight about 45 tons. Considerable discussion with respect to various angles to be considered -- condition of streets, removal and replacement of trees possible manhole and water main damage. Trustee Wyatt suggested that inquiry be made as to whether bond should be furnished; that as to tree removal from parkway the Village should be reimbursed a fair sum; that the President consult with the Engineers relating to various phases of this matter.

UPDATING VILLAGE ZONING MAP BY KINCAID & ASSOCIATES. Village Clerk desires approval of letter updating Village Zoning Map by Kincaid & Associates. Motion by Trustee Wyatt that Village Zoning Map be updated. Second by Trustee Shultz. Ayes.

PARKWAY TREE PLANTING RESOLUTION. Resolution prepared by Attorney and read by Mr. Zelsdorf. After some discussion it was felt correction should be made relating to "Property Line". Motion by Trustee Wyatt that the Resolution passed at the last Board meeting be amended as indicated by the Resolution submitted at this Board meeting. Second by Trustee Shultz. ROLL CALL - Ayes: Capulli, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

HOFFMAN ESTATES vs SOUTH BARRINGTON-Legal Documents. Brief and Abstract received from Atty. Johnson. Copy furnished Trustee Capulli and Wyatt.

DECALS FOR VILLAGE OWNED MOTOR VEHICLES. Design of PD decal presented by Chief Muscarello, who suggested a correction. Discussion followed as to decals for other Village owned cars. Motion by Trustee Wyatt that the Police Department and Supt. of Public Works be authorized to purchase the necessary decals for Village owned motor vehicles in accordance with plans submitted. Second by Trustee Shultz. ROLL CALL-Ayes: Capulli, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

GRAVEL TAX DISTRIBUTION. Letter of Atty. Byron Matthews, dated March 9, 1964, read. Discussion followed. It was felt that the Attorney should follow up further as to the Gravel Tax, not the Road and Bridge, and why Village does not receive its prorata share. Motion by Trustee Long that the Village Attorney be directed to further investigate and report

on the Gravel Tax situation - Cuba Township, and specifically request Village share. Second by Trustee Wyatt. ROLL CALL - Ayes: Capulli, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

TRAFFIC ORDINANCE REVISION ON PAINTING VEHICLE PARKING STALLS. Board may want to consider revising Section 16.1406 and Section 16.412 Village Code.

ILLEGAL CONNECTIONS TO SANITARY AND STORM SEWERS. Matter held in abeyance until Trustee Voss' return.

SIGN ORDINANCE. Trustee Shultz reported that the Building Committee has gone over it and made some changes. Final draft will be set up for review at next meeting; also review of Plumbing Code is under advisement.

BARRINGTON LINCOLN-LAND DAY AT NEW YORK WORLD'S FAIR. Invitation received from the Illinois Land of Lincoln Committee. Fair will open April 22nd and continue through October 18. There is an Illinois section covering over one acre with space set aside in the pavilion. Municipalities are requested to exhibit. Purpose is to advertise Illinois and the Municipality in particular. Suggestion by Trustee Wyatt that the matter be referred to President Blanke for consideration.

PICKWICK PLACE PROJECT. Committee meeting report. Reference made to Brough letter dated February 28, 1964 and Consoer Townsend & Associates (Hodel) letter dated March 2, 1964.

NORTH PARK WATER METER RELOCATION. Information submitted by Engineers referred to Park Board; they to be contacted.

VILLAGE AUDIT - 1964. Motion by Trustee Long that Putta and Kelsey be authorized to make an audit of the Village of Barrington for the fiscal year 1964. Second by Trustee Capulli. ROLL CALL - Ayes: Capulli, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

COMMITTEE REPORTS. Trustee Wyatt had nothing to report. Trustee Shultz requested that a letter be initiated to the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad requesting paving of commuter platform; also fence installed. President Blanke will follow up on this. Inquiry made as to compliance by Dr. DeArmas relating to driveway on the north side of the property; parking on Village property on weekends, checking to see if there are any violations; another traffic count this year; installation of lights. (Chief Muscarello to follow up); commuter traffic surveillance Cook and Lake Streets when they leave the Lots. Trustee Long reported no word as yet as to reimbursement by the Centennial Committee to the Village. President Blanke stated he understood a committee has been appointed to meet with the Board sometime in April; that the Village bill was sent to the Committee in January. Trustee Long further stated we want to be sure that action is being taken. One name has been received for Human Relations Committee; nothing we can do about it. A final study of the Bond issue matter received from Consoer Townsend & Associates, which Trustee Long will review; his feeling is that 15 years is the way we should go; that Call premium is illegal as to Water and

Sewer Revenue Bonds. Atty. Byron Matthews has stated that we might go up to 20 years and then, as reserves increase, call the '55 issue beginning '67. Trustee Long will get in touch with a Municipal Bonding house. It was felt that final recommendation should be available at the next meeting.

Trustee Capulli had nothing to report.

Whereupon President Blanke stated Committee to meet after Board adjourns for discussion of matter with Brough and Braithwaite.

Motion by Trustee Capulli to adjourn meeting, seconded by Trustee Shultz.

Gentlemen:

In compliance with the action taken by the Board at its meeting on March 9, 1964, we have prepared and are enclosing three (3) copies of a Motor Fuel Tax Resolution which provides for the improvement of Summit Street from approximately 310 feet south of Russell Street to Hillside Avenue, and Liberty Street from North Avenue to Ela Street, and which appropriates \$16,000 for the improvements, to be known as MFT Section 22-CS. The improvements consist of constructing a bituminous surface, State Specifications Subclass I-11, on the existing concrete pavements, together with pavement and curb and gutter replacements and adjustment of drainage structures as required. 23 C-3.

We also enclose three (3) copies of an Arterial Street Resolution which designates Summit Street between Russell Street and Wisconsin Avenue as Arterial Street No. 1, and Liberty Street from North Avenue to Hough Street as Arterial Street No. 30. The designation of Summit Street is actually an extension of Arterial Street No. 1, since a portion of Summit Street is presently arterial. The designation of Liberty Street is a new arterial and although the only portion that need be designated as applicable to the paving improvement extends from North Avenue to Ela Street, we have designated the remaining portion of Liberty Street to Hough. This was discussed with Mr. Herb Richmond of the State Highway Department at Elgin and he tentatively approved this designation. All of Summit Street, upon approval of this Arterial Street Resolution, will be arterial. This addition of a portion of Summit Street as arterial, as represented in the attached Resolution, is necessary in connection with the proposed resurfacing and maintenance of this street.

Re: 1964 MFT Program

Gentlemen:

In accordance with your request, we have consulted with Mr. Blanke and Mr. Johansen in regard to the Village's MFT program proposed for 1964 and prepared preliminary estimates of costs. MFT funds available for this purpose, based on present balances in completed projects and anticipated allotments through November 1964, will total approximately \$31,000, which sum will be adequate to complete the entire program as hereinafter outlined.

This program will be divided into two parts, namely Maintenance and Construction, and they consist of the following:

Maintenance:

This work will be performed on the following streets and consists of constructing a bituminous seal coat, subclass A-1 specification, including scarifying and shaping roadway (adding gravel as necessary and prime coat) where required, all work being similar to the maintenance work completed the past two summers:

The total estimated cost of this maintenance work is \$13,830, which amount includes an allowance for engineering.

Construction:

The improvement of the following streets will consist of resurfacing with bituminous concrete binder and surface courses, subclass I-11 specifications, together with pavement and curb and gutter replacements and adjustment of drainage structures as required:

The total estimated cost of both the maintenance and construction work is \$29,780. Since it is anticipated that approximately \$31,000 from MFT funds will be available for this year's work, we recommend the Village proceed with both the maintenance and construction program as outlined above.

Some of the streets in the aforementioned maintenance program are on the arterial street system. The maintenance work, however, may be performed on all of the listed streets under an arterial and non-arterial program, similar to that prepared last year.

In connection with the construction program, Summit Street at the location proposed for resurfacing and Liberty Street are not on the arterial street system. When we are authorized by the Village to proceed with these improvements, we will arrange at that time to obtain State approval of the Village's proposal for designating them as arterial streets.

Gentlemen:

The question has come up of changing the arrangements as to the township road and bridge tax to permit the Village of Barrington to get more road and bridge tax money.

One proposal is to increase the amount of road and bridge tax levied by the township -- with the corresponding reduction in the so-called gravel tax -- so that the Village's share of the road and bridge tax would be increased proportionately. Very little increase is possible by this procedure, as the township is presently levying 5¢ per \$100 of assessed valuation, and the State's Attorney has ruled that under the scaling provisions of the Butler Bill, the limit is approximately 6¢. The 1¢ increase in the rate would not substantially increase the Village's share.

There may be some confusion as to how the 6¢ limit was arrived at by the State's Attorney. I do not believe it is the Village's duty to become involved in this controversy, as the State's Attorney is, by law, the legal advisor to the County Clerk in determining tax rate limits.

There is a simple way whereby the Village could obtain more money for road and bridge purposes. The Village can levy its own road and bridge tax, and in addition the Village can levy an additional road and bridge tax, by a three-fourths vote. This might result in a total receipt greater than that established by the Village's share of the road and bridge tax.

If the Village Board is interested in pursuing this, we can make a study of the maximum rates available under Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 24, paragraphs 11-81-1 and 11-81-2, as limited by Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 120, paragraph 482 and following, and as further limited by the previous history of the Village, under the present and former provisions of Chapter 120, paragraph 643a.

This applies to only to tax rates established by referendum after January 1, 1946 or established by a municipal corporation formed after January 1, 1946. Other tax rates are subject to a different formula, depending on the history of the particular municipality).
