Dear Mr. Wyatt:

Thank you for the fiscal report material for the village of Barrington, Illinois. As I have contemplated the pending job offer of the village board, it seemed to me that I should spell out in writing the points covered in phone conversations with you and with Mr. Voss, to-wit:

1. The salary of 10,000 per annum plus moving expenses is acceptable.
2. I would like to be furnished <sup>pertinent</sup> ~~pertinent~~ information on accompanying benefits to the job, i.e., group hospitalization (my wife is expecting our second child in February) annual leave, sick leave, holidays, **Attendance** at state & national conferences, etc.
3. It is extremely helpful for Mr. Voss to be thoughtful enough to begin to gather information on housing, since that is one of the greatest dissatisfactions that we have experienced in Gaithersburg. We would like to rent a home primarily, but should it prove to <sup>be</sup> expensive, would like being in a two family dwelling, then an apartment in that order of preference. Mr. Voss volunteered to send the local newspaper and a listing of available places which will be most appreciated.
