Rules For The Earrington Woman's Club Scholarship School Year 1972-73

- 1. The amount of the scholarship for the academic year 1972-73 shall be \$500.00.
- 2. Eligibilty of candidate:
 - a. must be in the upper 25% of the senior class of the Barrington High School.
 - b. must have been a resident of the Barrington area for the entire senior year.
 - c. applicant must choose any accredited college, technical school or university qualified to bestow the degree of Bachelor of Arts or of Science by the American Association of Colleges.
- 3. Application should be submitted by April 17th to a committee consisting of the Principal or his representative and at least two counselors. These shall select four applicants in the order 1,2,3,4, and shall submit these names to the chairman of the Wmman's Club Scholarship Committee before May 1st. The Scholarship Committee shall then pick from this list the person to receive the scholarship.
- 4. The committee shall judge the applicant on the basis of scholarship, course of study, and need (not necessarily) in that order). Special consideration might be given to a son or daughter of a member of the Woman's Club.
- 5. Acceptance of the scholarship must be made no later than thirty days following the date upon which notice of the award is received by the winner. Awards not accepted within the designated time will be withdrawn. If recipient does not complete the college year following receipt of the award, he or she will be expected to make prorata restitution as determined by the Barrington Woman's Club.
- 6. The scholarship is a one year award; however, each recipient may apply to the phatrody/o Scholarship Chairman of the Barrington Woman's Club by letter for renewal through successive academic years. Menewals/may/be/granted/provided
