## BARRINGTON WOMAN'S CLUB CIVICS COMMITTEE REPORT

The committee was formed this year to find a way to help the village of Barrington celebrate this country's Bi-centennial. I was named Decorations Chairman on the Barrington Area Bicentennial Commission and the Barrington Woman's Club Civics Committee served as the Decorations Committee.

This committee recommended 8-foot "Betsy Ross" banners for the Village lampposts. With ~~our~~ our budgeted \$50.00 and Woman's Club Board approval of a donation of \$250.00, I went to the commission for approval of the purchase of 12 banners. The commission approved, as did the Chamber of Commerce and the Village Board. Other clubs joined in the project and 30 banners were hung on Flag Day.

We also recommended the painting of fire hydrants by the High School Art Club and followed through on this project. About 20 hydrants were painted with profiles of historical figures such as Washington, Lincoln, Twain etc.

This committee decorated a permanent stage for downtown events and two movable stages for events in outlying areas. A 40-foot banner was made of bunting to hang at the entrance to the park for family picnic day and we poured the concrete, polished the copper, applied the hardware etc. for 12 flagpoles to hold the commemorative flags donated by the VFW. Needless to say, we were also responsible for or located the equipment or manpower needed to complete these projects.

My sincere thanks to this committee and simply, in the words of many, many people on the commission and in the town "that was a great committee and they really did an outstanding job": Carrie Bergren, Irene Hammer, Georgiana Hansen, Barb Hoffeller, Gen Kaercher, Marlene Merrick, Adele Moore, Mary Reinhart, Janis Shaner, Stephanie Young and Helen Zoern (who was named vice-president of the Commission).
