

MINUTES OF MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES  
OF THE VILLAGE OF LAKE BARRINGTON

January 7, 1980

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Barrington was held on Monday, January 7, 1980 at 8 p. m. in the Village Hall, Kelsey Road, Barrington, Illinois as provided for by ordinance. On roll call, the following answered:

Present: President Wood, Trustees Carroll, Krueger, Smith and Tucker

Absent: Trustees O'Connor and Rebmann

Also present: Attorney Springer and Ray Donini

A motion was made by Trustee Tucker and seconded by Trustee Krueger to accept the treasurer's report. On roll call, the vote was:

Yeas: Trustees Tucker, Krueger, Smith and Carroll

Nays: None

The motion carried.

The village clerk read correspondence. Trustee Carroll stated that many communities have not entered into contracts with cable t-v concerns but have banded together into organizations to better consider the pros and cons. He volunteered to obtain more information re the cable tv franchises.

President Wood appointed Trustee Rebmann to study the possibility of our becoming a participant in the Illinois Risk Management Association to cover our insurance needs.

The Board directed Attorney Springer to draft an amendment to the fee ordinance whereby application fees submitted with petitions for annexation would be refunded if petitions were denied.

The clerk read the bills as follows:

A motion was made by Trustee Krueger and seconded by Trustee Smith to pay the bills. On roll call, the vote was:

Yeas: Trustees Krueger, Smith, Tucker and Carroll

Nays: None

The motion carried.

Attorney Springer reported that there is no building permit fee due from Mr. Freier for the addition on his barn since the structure will be used for agricultural purposes. The village may charge inspection fees if desired. Mr. Donini will issue the permit without charge.

Mr. Donini was directed to request the state plumbing inspector to view plumbing installations at Lake Barrington Shores when he is in the village to inspect a home in Twin Pond Farm Subdivision.

A motion was made by Trustee Krueger and seconded by Trustee Tucker that 90% or \$900 of the subdivision application fee be returned to the Church of the Holy Apostles, the remainder of the fee to be applied toward village expenses incurred in approving the tentative and final plats of Holy Apostles Subdivision. On roll call, the vote was:

Yeas: Trustees Tucker, Krueger, Carroll and Smith

Nays: None

The motion carried.

Activities on the Pawlenko-Lamping parcel were reviewed. Attorney Springer read a copy of the letter received from Natalie Pawlenko Lamping's attorney and the Board directed Mr. Springer to reply detailing the activities that the village is objecting to.

A motion was made by Trustee Carroll and seconded by Trustee Smith to pass Ordinance No. 80-0-1, an Ordinance Repealing the Ordinance Providing for the Issuance of Motor Vehicle Stickers. On roll call, the vote was:

Yeas: Trustees Carroll, Smith, Krueger and President Wood

Nays: Trustee Tucker

The motion carried.

A motion was made by Trustee Krueger and seconded by Trustee Tucker to pass Ordinance No. 80-0-2, an ordinance amending the liquor control ordinance making it unlawful to sell alcoholic liquor to any person under the age of 21. On roll call, the vote was:

Yeas: Trustees Krueger, Tucker, Carroll and Smith

Nays: None

The motion carried.

The Board gave permission for the purchase of a fireproof file for village records storage.

A motion was made by Trustee Krueger and seconded by Trustee Carroll to adjourn the meeting. The voice vote was unanimous and the meeting adjourned at 9:45 p. m.
