

Minutes the Regular Meeting Of The Board Of Trustees  
Of The Village Of Lake Barrington Held December 2, 1968,

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Barrington was held on Tuesday, December 2, 1968, at Sales Analysis Institute, Kelsey Road, Barrington, Illinois. On roll call the following answered:

Present: President Hubschman, Trustees Nelson, Meiners, Tucker, Wienecke, Spicer, and Schleifer

Absent: Treasurer Roy Peavey, Clerk Orbesen  
Also Present: Attorney Eva Schwartzman.

President Hubschman appointed Trustee Schleifer Clerk Pro-Tem in the absence of Clerk Orbesen.

The Village Clerk Pro-tem read the minutes of November 5 meeting and a motion was made by Trustee Nelson and seconded by Trustee Tucker to approve the minutes as read. On roll call the vote was:

The motion carried and the minutes were approved.

Trustee Tucker presented a bill from the Island Lake Service Center for a stand-by fee for snow removal.

A bill was presented from Wight Consulting Engineers for surveying roads in Lake Barrington Industrial Park and the Northwest Barrington Industrial Park.

A motion was made by Trustee Nelson and seconded by Trustee Tucker to approve payment of the Wight bill. On roll call the vote was;

A motion was made by Trustee Nelson and seconded by Trustee Tucker to accept the roads in the Lake Barrington Industrial Park and the Northwest Barrington Industrial Park. On roll call the vote was

LAKE COUNTY DOG ORDINANCE.  
EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 30, 1967.

Section. 2

No owner of a dog shall permit said dog to run at large in the residential areas of the unincorporated portions of the County. Any dog found running at large contrary to provisions of this Section shall be impounded by the County Animal Warden who shall then give a seven (7) day notice to the owner if known, that said dog has been impounded. Any dog impounded under the provisions of this section shall be redeemable by the payment of the room and board.

Section. 4

Any dog found anywhere in the unincorporated areas of the County not having a collar upon its neck and a current Rabies Tag affixed thereto shall be apprehended as a stray and Rabies suspect and impounded as a public nuisance. All stray and rabies suspect dogs, not claimed by the owner within three (3) days, will be disposed of.

Section. 5 Biting of person by a dog or other animal.

Whenever any person has been bitten by a dog or other animal, the Rabies Inspector shall have such animal confined in the custody of and observed by a licensed veterinarian in Lake County, for a period of ten (10) days.

Section. 6 PENALTIES.

Whoever violates this Act by permitting a dog to run at large shall be fined not less than five (\$5.00) dollars nor more than fifty (\$50.00) dollars.

Section. 3 RABIES VACCINATION.

Every owner of a dog five (5) months of age or older shall cause said dog to be vaccinated for rabies once each year, and provide the dog with a collar or harness and attach the official tag which shall be worn by the dog at all times.
