## December 3, 1979

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Barrington was held on December 3, 1979 at 8 p.m. in the Village Hall, Kelsey Road, Barrington, Illinois as provided for by ordinance. On roll call, the following answered:

A motion was made by Trustee Rebmann and seconded by Trustee Krueger to appoint Trustee O'Connor president pro tem in the temporary absence of the president from the village. On roll call, the vote was:

The motion carried

A motion was made by Trustee Tucker and seconded by Trustee Smith to approve the minutes of the November 5, 1979 meeting as submitted. On roll call, the vote was:

A motion was made by Trustee Rebmann and seconded by Trustee Krueger to accept the Treasurer's Report. On roll call, the vote was:

A motion was made by Trustee Krueger and seconded by Trustee Smith to accept the Report of the Plan Commission re Roberts Road Estates Subdivision, not within the village but within 11/2 miles of the boundaries. On roll call, the vote was:

A motion was made by Trustee Tucker and seconded by Trustee Krueger to adopt Resolution No. 79-R-24 approving the final plat of Roberts Road Estates Subdivision. On roll call, the vote was:

President Pro Tem O'Connor recognized Mr. Art Freier, Kelsey Road, who stated that he should not be charged a building permit fee for a barn addition under construction. After discussion, the Board directed Attorney Springer to check on the matter.

A motion was made by Trustee Krueger and seconded by Trustee Rebmann to adopt Resolution No. 79-R-25, an intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Barrington, re the discharge of sewage treatment plant effluent. On roll call, the vote was:

A motion was made by Trustee Rebmann and seconded by Trustee Smith to adopt Resolution No. 79-R-26 re approval of Tioga Trail-Lake Barrington Associates drainage plan. On roll call, the vote was:

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Trustee Tucker reported that the ditching and culvert work had been completed in Barrington Harbor Estates and Pine Hills but that seeding work would wait until spring.

A motion was made by Trustee Rebmann and seconded by Trustee Krueger to pass Ordinance No. 79-0-14 disannexing the village from the Lake County Soil and Water Conservation District. On roll call, the vote was:

A motion was made by Trustee Rebmann and seconded by Trustee Krueger to adopt Resolution No. 79-R-27 re execution of a contract with Camiros, Ltd. in the amount of \$27,600 for compilation of a comprehensive plan. On roll call, the vote was:

A motion was made by Trustee Krueger and seconded by Trustee Tucker to pass Ordinance No. 79-0-15 prohibiting parking along Rt. 59 in connection with the stop light installation at Miller Road and Rt. 59 in the Village. On roll call, the vote was:

The motion carried.

A motion was made by Trustee Krueger and seconded by Trustee Tucker that the plans for the stoplight installation submitted by Ill. Dept. of Transportation be approved for the intersection of Miller Road and Rt. 59. On roll call, the vote was:

The motion carried.

The trustees asked that discussion of parcels owned by the Schucks and Lampings be placed on the January agenda.

A motion was made by Trustee Rebmann and seconded by Trustee Krueger to adopt Resolution No. 79-R-28 re acceptance of roads in River's Bend Subdivision. On roll call, the vote was:

Mr. Parker, North Barrington Area Association representative, announced that Mr. Loren Miller will serve as a representative from Lake Barrington Shores to the NBAA meetings. Mr. Parker addressed the issue of cluster housing amendment to the county zoning ordinance and suggested that the Board register

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its disapproval of the proposed change. A motion was made by Trustee Smith and seconded by Trustee Krueger that the Board by resolution object to the proposed amendment. On roll call, the vote was:

Yeas: Trustees Smith, Krueger, Rebmann, Tucker and O'Connor

Nays: None

A motion was made by Trustee Rebmann and seconded by Trustee Krueger to adjourn the meeting. The voice vote was unanimous and the meeting adjourned at 10;30 p. m

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Barrington, Illinois that we are hereby registering our unanimous opposition to the Lake County proposed cluster subdivision zoning amendment.

BF IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that it is our opinion that the existing PUD ordinance permitting cluster zoning under tight control be maintained, that the attempt to supress opposition to the proposed cluster zoning subdivision amendment by packaging the amendment with the Natural Resource Plan is not in the best interests of the community and that the Natural Resource Plan be considered as a separate matter and not be used to influence anyone opposed to the cluster subdivision zoning amendment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we urge the Lake County Board to oppose the cluster subdivision zoning amendment.
