Welcome to Lake Barrington Shores!

One of the benefits of living in a Community environment is the availability of a wide variety of social, physical and recreational activities. Many of these activities are organized by the residents of Lake Barrington Shores, and are open to all residents. Visit the Recreational Center and check out the activities in which you wish to participate. Here at Lake Barrington Shores we are fortunate to have a variety of facilities and equipment available to all our residents.

Following is a listing and a brief explanation of clubs, activities and facilities available to you. LBS Activities

Artist League

The LBS Artist League is open to all LBS resident artists. Meetings are held on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7:30 p.m. at the Rec Center. Featured programs include artist demonstrations; slide presentations, speakers and artist critiques.

The LBS Artist League Exhibit and Sale held each autumn is considered one of the social events of the year enjoyed by all LBS residents and their guests. The League also displays their members' art in the Rec Center. The Club welcomes artists of all levels and media.

Bowling Highrollers League

The LBS Highrollers is a social league for men and women that bowl 14 weeks at 3-D Lanes in Island Lake every other Sunday afternoon between October and March. The teams are balanced with handicaps within 10 points of each other. The season begins with an annual brunch. At the end of the season there is a Bowling Banquet where awards and prizes are presented.

Bowling Woman's League

This organization is a social bowling league for women. The women bowl at 3-D Lanes in Island Lake every Thursday morning October through March and finish the season with a luncheon and awards and prizes.

Bridge Fourth Wednesday Club

The Club plays Bridge on the fourth Wednesday of each month. Open to men and women, the members meet for coffee and 9:45 AM and play begins at 10:00 AM and ends around 2:30 PM. Each player brings his or her own lunch. For newcomers to LBS, it's a wonderful way to get acquainted. For long time residents, it's a way to stay in touch with friends and neighbors. Guests of residents are welcome.

Bridge Good Shepherd Hospital Marathon

This bridge marathon is a fundraiser for Good Shepherd Hospital and is for the women of LBS, played by partnership participants. The group meets monthly from September through April. Twice a year each member entertains a table of bridge in their home. In April, all the women meet to play as a group at the Rec Center. This all day event includes social hour, catered luncheon, bridge, awards and door prizes. The group is open to all residents interested in joining, as space permits.

The object of this league is to promote challenging competition in the true spirit of golf. Membership is open to any female member of LBS Golf Club, 18 years or older, who meets the handicap requirement as defined in the standing rules. Tuesday is the scheduled league day with the exception of some special events.

Golf Shoresmen League

The Shoresmen is a golf and social organization for primarily retired or semi-retired men who are current members of LBS Golf Club. The purpose is to provide an opportunity for men who live in LBS to meet and get better acquainted. The golf league meets every Wednesday from April through October at 7:00 am with a 7:30 am start. A different 18-hole game with prizes by flight (A-B-C) is played each week. At the end of the season, there is an annual tournament and banquet for everyone.

The Shoresmen Social Group meets for lunch on the first Thursday of every month. The members of the Social Group need not be members of the LBS Golf Club. The Group is involved in many non-golf activities, such as, cards at the Recreation Center, dinner theater parties at the Lincolnshire Theater, trips to Arlington Park and other Chicago attractions. The year culminates with a Shoresmen Christmas Party at the Rec Center.

Golf Sundowners

This golf league is for couples and singles that get together at LBS Golf Club every other Friday evening from May through September for 9 holes of golf. Both partners of the couple need not be golfers. Individuals will be paired with other golfers. Cocktails, dinner and socializing take place after golf.

The LBS Sailing Association (LBSSA) promotes sailing on our lake. Their sailing program includes a July 4th Regatta, the Sunsplash Regatta in August and the summer-long Nugent series consisting of three races every other Sunday. Typically, the social calendar includes the Sunset Party in May, the 4th of July Picnic, Sunsplash Beach Party in August and the Lobster Fest/Awards Dinner in October, along with impromptu float boat cocktail cruises and cook-outs on the beach on Sunday afternoons. Residents who wish instructions in how to sail can join the Sailing Association for an annual membership fee and request assistance in learning from a qualified member.

In addition to sailors, the Association has many social members. Some social members help run the races from the Committee Boat, others go along for the ride or gather on the beach for fun, food and drink.

Bridge Men's Club

The Men of LBS meet every Tuesday afternoon at 1:00 PM in the Rec Center. All LBS men and their guests are invited to attend.

Bridge Evening Party Bridge for Men and Women

The LBS Bridge Club meets every Thursday at 7:15 PM at the Rec Center. The Club is open to all residents of LBS and welcomes newcomers.

Condo Association Events

All residents are invited to become actively involved in the business and social activities of their own Condo Association. A good start is attendance at the monthly meetings run by your Condo Board. Participation greatly enriches living at LBS. For information on your individual Condo meetings, be sure to check the Information Channel.

Conservators

The Conservators help preserve the woodland habitat in LBS with special projects throughout our naturalized areas including both the forest preserve and lake. Volunteers work from April through October at 1:30 p.m. on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays and 1:30 p.m. on Tuesdays.

Fishing

Fishing either from shore or LBS rowboats is allowed in our 90-acre lake that is stocked with Panfish, Bass, Northern Pike and Catfish. Live bait other than worms is not permitted and a current fishing license is required! Panfish are "keepers" but other fish are on a "catch and release" basis. Oars and lifejackets are available from the front security gate. Personally supplied electric trolling motors can be used.

Garden Club

This is a wolunteer group that plans and works with the Landscape Commission to beautify our community especially LBS"s common flower beds with both seasonal and holiday plants. In the Spring, the Club sponsors a "Spring Plant Sale" of bedding plants and hanging baskets. Proceeds of the sale are used for fall flowering plants and other beautification efforts. A "Garden Walk" is held in July providing an opportunity to visit some of the wonderful gardens and courtyard areas of participating LBS residents. Garden Club meetings are held on the 2nd Thursday of the month at 7:30 p.m. at the Rec Center.

Golf Golfing Solos

Membership of this social league is open to couples and singles that are LBS Golf Club members with a current sanctioned handicap. Social memberships are also available to LBS residents who are members of LBS Golf Club. Golfers participate in a 9-hole format on alternative Fridays commencing the beginning of May and finishing the end of September. Each week, sign up is on a first come first serve basis and may be done individually, or in groups. Cocktails, hors d'oeuvres and dinner are served at the LBS Recreation Center immediately following the golfing activities.

Golf Women's 9 Hole Golf League

This league provides women with a positive and friendly atmosphere where women can improve their golf skills and learn the rules and etiquette of the game: to promote safe and courteous play among the members while establishing fellowship and golf contacts within the LBS Golf Club.

Golf Women's 18 Hole Golf League

All residents who love to garden are welcome to join the Shorecroppers at their annual Registration and New Members Party the first Sunday in April. Refreshments are served along with a brief overview on the joys of becoming a Shorecropper. Growing your own vegetables is both fun and rewarding and you will have an abundance of grateful neighbors.

A minimum fee entitles one to a garden plot, to utilize yourself or share. The field is plowed and wooden walks are installed. Water and hoses are provided, as well as fresh fertilizer, garden tools and tomato cages.

Shorestitchers

This is a small Social group focusing on all types of needlework; counted cross-stitches, crochet, quilting, knitting, mending and needle point. All levels of skill and interest are welcome. The group regularly meets on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays at 1:00 PM in the upper level of the Rec Center and welcomes anyone at anytime.

Tennis

There are 10 courts available for play for personal or Lake Barrington Shores Tennis Association (LBSTA) use. There are ball machines available for rent and tennis lessons available through a local professional. The LBSTA schedules round robin, team and individual tournaments with local competition and with neighboring tennis clubs.

Tennis Platform/Paddle

This sport combines tennis and racquetball skills and is played from October through April in our 3 heated and lighted platform courts. Guests or participants may choose to view the courts from the warming facility. Paddles and balls may be rented. Required reservations may be made through the Rec Center.
