Trustee Urick, chairman of the Trustees Committee on Finance and Law, advised that with these invoices legal expenses will exceed the budgeted amount. After discussion Trustee Urick submitted Resolution No. 1812 covering the reallocation of funds to the Legal fund as follows:

The \$1,300.00 - regether with the budget for legal expenses - will result in a Legal Fund of \$3,500.00.

The Trustees Committee on Finance and law will meet with Attorney Braithwaite to review future legal arrangements and will review the progress report on the Landwer case.

After turther discussion Trustee Keasy moved to adopt Resolution No. 182 to reallocate the funds - seconded by Trustee Cutler and passed unanimously.

Trustee Schulke moved to approve payment of invoices from King, Robin, Gale & Pillinger totaling \$1,748.89 - seconded by Trustee Cutler.

By roll call vote: AYES - Messrs. Cutler, Forrest, Keagy, Krumlinde, Schulke,
Urick and Anderson.

NAYS - None.

The President declared the motion carried.

POLICE: Chief R. E. Svacha reported complaints and incidents as follows:

Two automobile accidents - (extensive property damage.)

Three dogs captured or picked up and impounded on receipt of signed complaints.

Run-away teenage girl.

Several complaints of telephone annoyances - suspicious or obscene.

HEALTH & SANITATION: Dr. A. Barlow reported no unusual activity in her department. It will be necessary to wait for spring thawing and warmer weather before much action can be taken.

ROADS: No report.

BUILDING OFFICER: No report.

PARKS & AUXILIARY SERVICES: No report.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT: Supt. Lyle M. Palmer advised he had been exploring and studying the proposed plan to install martin birdhouses on public properties.

Mr. Palmer said that a high grade type of birdhouse can be secured through Alden's - (his company) - from the manufacturer - in lots of 12 - at a cost of \$12.45 for the house and \$8.37 for the pole. Several residents have indicated a desire to purchase one of the birdhouses for their personal property. After discussion Trustee Krumlinde moved that approval be given to the purchase of 12 martin birdhouses - three at Village expense - and the remaining nine to be sold to residents on a "first come-first served" basis. The purchase of the birdhouses would be included in the 1966 appropriation. Seconded by Trustee Keagy and passed unanimously.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION</u>: The President advised he had received a letter from Mr. D.J.Wangelin resigning as chairman and member of the Plan Commission due to business reasons, and that no action will be taken until the next regular Board meeting.

BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS: The President submitted for ratification the appointment of Edward C. Gross Jr., as Vice-Chairman of the Board of Zoning Appeals for the duration of his term as a member of the Board of Zoning Appeals. After discussion Trustee Forrest moved the appointment be confirmed and consented to and moved the adoption of Resolution No. 183 appointing Mr. Gross - seconded by Trustee Cutler and passed unanimously.

The President advised that a public hearing had been held on Saturday, March 26, 1966, on petition of Mr. M. R. Miller, 186 North Signal Hill Road, to recognize the original subdivision of his property, consisting of approximately 9.1 acres, into two tracts - Nos. 14 and 15.

The Board of Zoning Appeals met on March 26, 1966, immediately following the public hearing, and after review under Section 13 - Appeals for Variation - of Zoning Ordinance No. 8, and as there were no objectors or objections, motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously by roll call vote to recommend to the Board of Trustees that the petition for a variation to the Zoning Regulation to declare Lot 15 in the Signal Hill Unit, Biltmore Country Estates, Zoned Rl, consisting of 4.1/ acres with a frontage of 335.96 feet on Barrington Road (North Signal Hill Road) as a buildable lot separate from contiguous lot 14, be allowed - and further - that the variation on lot 14 as a separate homesite having an area of approximately 4.51 acres with a frontage of 427.52 feet be allowed.

After discussion Trustee Forrest moved that the Board of Trustees concur in the recommendations of the Board of Zoning Appeals and allow the variations, recognizing that the land has been two parcels and was two parcels at the time it came into the Village. Trustee Keagy seconded the motion.

The President declared the motion carried by more than 2/3 vote.

The President submitted Ordinance No. 70 - a variation ordinance to allow the subdivision of Mr. M. R. Miller's property into two tracts. Trustee Forrest moved for the adoption of Ordinance No. 70 - seconded by Trustee Keagy.

Urick and Anderson.

NAYS: None.

The President declared the motion carried by more than 2/3 wote,

FINANCE AND LAW: Trustee Urick advised that the Finance Committee has met and set up a tentative appropriation for the year. It is the intent to meet with certain department heads in an effort to cut down some proposed budgets to meet the proposed total appropriation.

PLANNING AND ZONING: Trustee Forrest reported that a study of the Lake County Zoning Amendment which becomes effective March 31, 1966, shows that Cuba Township fared very well.

ROADS AND PUBLIC UTILITIES: Trustee Schulke advised that Consoer, Townsend and Associates have promised to submit recommendations for review with the Road Committee before the next Board meeting. They have advised that the Village has plenty of time to make road repairs since there is still too much water in the ground to bring in heavy equipment.

POLICE, FIRE AND PUBLIC SAFETY: No report.

BUILDING REGULATIONS HEALTH & SANITATION:

No report.

PARKS & AUXILIARY SERVICES: The President reported on the study made by the North Creek Study Group - - -

On March 19, 1966, seven men - village officials and residents - walked along the north creek, which runs south of Miller Road between Mighway 59 and Kumberly Road -- viewed the conditions along the creek, observed and appraised those conditions where waters were dammed by logs, trees, branches and other debris - cleared some blocked areas - marveled at the beauty of a couple or locations where residents have created large stone waterfalls, and made notations of blocked water conditions.

In general it would appear that some homeowners have not been keaping the creek clear of debris, which has been causing serious flooding conditions from time to time upstream.

It is recognized in a few instances some logs which have fallen into and across the stream may require men and equipment capable of moving such large logs, but by-and-large most of the clearing and cleaning of debris could be accomplished by the residents or by our Boy Scout Troop.

Scoutmaster Robert Albrecht has indicated an interest in this situation because it offers Boy Scouts an opportunity to earn required merit awards in scouting.

The following areas were not covered in this trip:

South of Eton into the Foster property and then east to Kimberly Road.

East of Kimberly Road to Ela Township line - except short distances where conditions were visible from the road.

The President indicated he will again talk with Mr. Robert Albrecht relative to having the Boy Scouts clear the light debris from the creek, and will also ascertain whether or not the Scouts are insured, and Village Hability.

The President advised that at the meeting on water pollution and health problems it was suggested that a study should be made of woterworks and planning, to get the facts. It is proposed to appoint a fact-finding committee to gather the facts for submission to the Plan Commission and Board of Trustees.

The President reported that he and the Building Officer have reviewed the permit rees charged for new construction and improvements. The original ordinance does not give a clear formula for deciding the amount to be charged. After discussion the President submitted Ordinance No. 10.1 - an ordinance prescribing fees for building and septic system permits. Trustee Cutler moved to adopt Ordinance No. 10.1 - seconded by Trustee Urick.

By roll call vote: AYES: Messrs. Cutler, Forrest, Kengy, Krumlinde, Schulke, Urick and Anderson.

NAYS: None.

The President declared the motion carried by unanimous vote

The President introduced Mr. Steve Zavodny, 204 Beachview Drive, who urged the Board to view the erosion of Beachview Drive along and into the Honey Lake channel - and the trees along the bank - some of which have already fallen into the channel because

soil erosion. The Board informed Mr. Zavodny they are aware of this condition, that contractors are urged to spread clay from excavations and some clay has already been dumped - but not near enough. Trustee Schulke informed Mr. Zavodny the Road Committee will again view the condition and report to the Board with recommendations.

The President advised that the Village has been solicited by the Northeastern Illinois Planning Commission for a contribution of \$50.00. Also, that he had received from them three copies of the 1965 public hearing proceedings. After discussion the matter was held over for a month.

Trustee Forrest suggested the matter of annexations of the "island" properties on Kimberly Road be put on the agenda for the next meeting.

The President read a letter from H. W. Springs Jr., Attorney at Law, Waukegan, Illinois, dated February 24. 1966, relative to integration.
