Trustee Cutler moved to approve the minutes of the July 24, 1967 meeting -  
seconded by Trustee Davis and passed unanimously.

OFFICERS' REPORTS

TREASURER: Treasurer Gerry reported balances as of August 28, 1967 as follows:

Davis -

The President declared the motion carried.

VILLAGE CLERK: The clerk presented invoices for approval totaling \$3,737.66.

By roll call vote: AYES - Trustees Cutler, Davis, Keagy, Krumlinde and Schulke.  
NAYS - None  
ABSENT - Trustee Forrest

The President declared the motion carried.

The clerk presented for ratification payment of invoice from Lloyd's Service  
for gasoline for the Police Department in amount \$26.29. Trustee Schulke  
moved to ratify the payment - seconded by Trustee Keagy and passed unanimously.

The President submitted Resolution No. 224 - a resolution to authorize rental of an SCM Coronastat 44 Copier on a five year lease-purchase agreement with decision to exercise purchase option deferred until expiration of the agreement. Trustee Krumlinde moved to adopt Resolution No. 224 - seconded by Trustee Keagy -

By roll call vote: AYES - Trustees Cutler, Davis, Keagy, Krumlinde and Schulke.  
NAYS - None  
ABSENT - Trustee Forrest.

The President declared the motion carried.

POLICE: In the absence of Chief R. E. Svacha, a complete report was deferred until the next regular meeting.

HEALTH OFFICER: The President advised that appointment of a Health Officer is still under consideration, and in the interim the President is acting as Health Officer and has reviewed several cases under investigation.

ROADS: Supt. C. M. Newgent advised that the 1967 MFT Road Program has been approved by the State - including 1967 snow removal. Mr. Newgent said the Wight Engineering Inc., have done an excellent job in a short time, and hope to have the work started within the next ten days or two weeks. An aerial map of the Village has been purchased at the suggestion of the Wight Company and will be available for use by other Village departments.

Mr. Newgent reported a drainage problem in Signal Hill and Honey Lake Roads, where water drains from Old Oak Road. He has requested Wight Engineers Inc. to investigate and submit a recommendation for a permanent solution.

Mr. Newgent also advised that the Illinois Bell Telephone Company has requested permission to put lines underground on Miller Road west of Highway 59, and that permission will be granted.

The President reported that the MFT road maintenance work should be contracted for and completed prior to September 15, 1967, to meet State requirements, and while Wight Engineers Inc., will request the State for an extension of time it is imperative the Village execute a contract with the lowest bidder at the earliest possible time. The President therefore submitted Resolution No. 222 - a resolution authorizing the Village President to execute the MFT 1967 contract to the lowest bidder at the September 11, 1967 bid date. Trustee Schulke moved to adopt Resolution No. 222 - seconded by Trustee Krumlinde and passed unanimously. The snow plowing contract will be considered after discussion with Wight Engineers about what is included in the MFT contract which has been approved by the State.

The President advised that a meeting was held with the developers of Oaksbury relative to development of the eastern section. It is their intention to include in their covenants upgraded requirements on septic installations. The President suggested that Mr. Newgent plan to attend the Plan Commission meetings to see that proper road specifications are followed.

BUILDING OFFICER: R. C. Emrick reported - 15 permits issued since March -

9 for new construction	- fees \$2,925
1 for septic installation	15
2 for remodeling	45
3 for repair of tornado damage	45

A letter has been sent to all residents who suffered tornado damage advising them that they must apply for a building permit even though the fees have been greatly reduced.

Mr. Emrick advised he had a meeting scheduled for August 29 - in Libertyville - with Mr. William Mellen - Lake County Senior Sanitarian - relative to correlating inspections of septic systems and suggested forms and procedures. President Anderson indicated he would try to arrange to meet also with Mr. Emrick and Mr. Mellen.

PARKS & AUXILIARY SERVICES: The President advised he had discussed the suspected diseased tree problem with Mr. Blazo and had been informed that arrangements were being made to have a man test the trees on Kimberly Road. Checks will be made also to determine if some of the trees are actually affected with Oak Wilt or if it could possibly be the affect of fogging, which a few individuals offered may be the cause seemingly of leave disease on lower branches.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT: The President advised that there have already been 7 foggings and that there possibly will be one more on the Labor Day week-end.

FIRE COMMISSIONER: No report.

CIVIL DEFENSE: The President advised that Civil Defense has been merged with the Police Department under the direction of Chief R. E. Svacha.

PLAN COMMISSION: The President advised a meeting will be called within the next week or ten days.

BOARD OF APPEALS: Chairman E. C. Gross Jr., reported his Board has several petitions pending.

TRUSTEES COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FINANCE & LAW: Trustee Schulke discussed the proposed tax levy, and presented Tax Levy Ordinance No. 86 - in amount \$23,500. After discussion Trustee Cutler moved for adoption of Tax Levy Ordinance No. 86 - seconded by Trustee Krumlinde -

The President requested ratification of the annexation of the Fifer property - Ordinance No. 85. Trustee Cutler so moved - seconded by Trustee Davis -



# TAX LEVY ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE No. 86

President and

WHEREAS, the <sup>1</sup> **Board of Trustees** of the <sup>2</sup> **Village** of **North Barrington** in the County of **Lake** and State of Illinois, did on the **26th** day of **June** A. D. 19 **67**, pass the annual appropriation bill for said <sup>2</sup> **Village** for the fiscal year beginning on the **first** day of **April** A. D. 19 **67**, the amount of which is ascertained to be the aggregate sum of **Fifty-nine thousand six hundred** Dollars, which said appropriation bill was duly **published** on the **sixth** day of **July** A. D. 19 **67**. Now, therefore,

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE LEVY AND ASSESSMENT OF TAXES FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR

BE IT ORDAINED by the <sup>1</sup> **Board of Trustees** of the <sup>2</sup> **Village** of **North Barrington** Illinois:

Section 1. That there be and is hereby levied upon all the taxable property within the corporate limits of said **Village of North Barrington** subject to taxation for the year, A. D. **1968**, the total sum of **Twenty-three thousand five hundred and NO/100** Dollars, for the following specific purposes mentioned in said appropriation bill and in the respective sums as follows, to-wit:
