individual budgets previously reported in the minutes of the special meeting ne 17, 1960 were read, and explained. The following changes were made: et of the Membership Committee was changed to include another nine hundred rs (\$900) for printing making a total of one thousand nine hundred eighty-five rs (\$1985); the General Assembly Benevolences item of the General Budget was sted on the basis of fifteen per cent, to four thousand one hundred twenty-five rs (\$4125); the budget of the Finance Committee was increased by eighty-five rs (\$85) to a total of five hundred dollars (\$500). With these changes the est-



imated expenditures provided for in the Church budget now amount to twenty-seven thousand seven hundred thirty-one dollars and forty-four cents (\$27,731.44

The motion for approval was made and seconded and the Church budget with the atmentioned changes was passed by the members of the Session.

It was recommended by William Rose that each committee should operate at ten percent less than the budget calls for.

The Worship Committee report was made by Jerry Joswick. It was announced that Committee had met and voted to appoint Miss Lohuis as the permanent organist of Church.

The Reverend Winchester reported that the average attendance at Church services, the month of May was one hundred twelve (112), for June one hundred eight (108). had our highest attendance and lowest attendance during the month of June.)

The Membership Committee reported through Gordon Monsen, chairman, that a num of calls on behalf of new members had been made. The Committee has received commember certificates and will deliver these certificates personally.

The Christian Education Committee report was made by William Rose, chairman. It wo pledge cards of ninety-five given out have been returned, amounting to five his fifty-five dollars (\$555) on an annual basis. The Committee has decided to send velopes to the forty-two students who have pledged. It is felt that the receipt of envelopes will be a stimulant to those students, who have not yet pledged.

To date seven of the students of our Church School have applied to go to Church $\operatorname{\mathsf{Camp}}$.

The Reverend Winchester announced that a Communion Service will be held Sunday July 10th.

The Minister has decided to break up his vacation by taking some time this summer and the remainder next winter. The Reverend Winchester will make provision for the Supply Ministers during his absence.

The Youth Group has proposed that they clear the Church land.

The Reverend Winchester suggested the congregation have a social gathering on the Church site following the clearing of the land. Bill Rose, Eldred Gough and Gordon Monsen were appointed as a committee to work with The Reverend Winches on establishing a date and making plans for the family get-together.

The meeting was adjourned at ten forty-five p.m.
