

LEADING EVENTS OF 1904 PRESENTED IN SUMMARY

War in the East Has Occupied the Center of the World's Stage During the Twelve Months Just Ended—Progress of Arbitration—Commercial Progress of the United States a Gratifying Feature—Railroad Director's Salary—Increase in Farm Wealth—Notable Names in the List of Those Numbered With the Dead.

Was occupied the center of the world's stage. The bloodiest war since the Crimean and Japan has been waged in the East. The progress of arbitration has been a gratifying feature. Battle of Yalu.—The first great battle of the war was fought on the Yalu river, near Antung and Yalu. The Japanese fleet, under the command of Admiral Togo, defeated the Russian fleet, under the command of Admiral Rozhanski. The Japanese fleet consisted of six battleships and eight cruisers.
