

NEW PRIMARY ELECTION LAW FOR THE STATE OF ILLINOIS

By Its Provisions Candidates for Office Will Hereafter Be Nominated by Direct Vote of the People.

RADICAL CHANGE FROM FORMER CONDITIONS

Fixed Dates for Primaries, Which Will Be Held on the Same Day Throughout the State by Parties Qualifying.

Old-Time Caucuses a Thing of the Past—What Candidates Must Now Do to Be Nominated for Offices—Points to Voters.

The new primary election law of Illinois, as enacted by the Forty-fourth general assembly of Illinois meets that heretofore, instead of the usual caucus, there has been held, each candidate for a nomination must submit his name to the voters of his district.

The law as herein defined applies to all counties of the state with the exception of Cook county.

The law applies to the state congressional districts, senatorial districts, district caucuses, and all cities and villages having a population of more than 1,000. It does not apply to township officers, which are elected from city caucuses.

There is nothing in the law to prevent the nomination of candidates by petition. Nominations by petition must be filed with the county clerk before 12 o'clock noon of the day previous to the day fixed for the primary election. If such information as to the names of those who constitute may be submitted by petition, sections 5, 6 and 7 of an act entitled "An act to amend the laws of this State in relation to the nomination of candidates for public offices," approved June 11, 1907, apply.

The signing signature on a petition, paper of uniform size must be made, and be placed together in book form, and the book must be placed in the hands of a clerk whose signature at every name is required. The book must contain the name of each person, and at the same time the name of the person who makes affidavit that he is the person who signs the name, and the name of the resident and voter in the primary. If a voter who signs a petition is not a voter at the primary, or as a primary, he is entitled of primary voting and may be removed by the petitioner. Any person voting at a primary is deemed to be signing a petition.

When Elections Are Held.
Primary elections shall be held on the first Monday of March in every year, and the date of officers for general elections will be fixed by the general assembly.

Qualification of Parties.
Only political parties having at least ten per cent of the vote for primary election in the county for the general election can have a primary election.

At least thirty days before a primary election the county central committee of each political party shall hold a meeting of a nature of which shall be sent to each member of the committee at least one week prior to the meeting, and the committee shall determine the said county central committee of each political party, and the names of the candidates to be nominated at the primary election.

Notice of Election.
