COURSCORE and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in liberty and dedicated to the proposition that all men we created equal. Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and to dedicated, can brige endure. We are not on a great battlefeld of that war. We haveome to dedicate a portion of that field as a final resting place for those who here gave their first, and proper that we should do this. But in a larger sense we cannot hallow this ground. The brave men, living and deal, who struggled here have consertated it far above our power to add or detract. The world will little note not long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us, the living, rather to be dedicated here to the unfaished work which they who fought here have thus the sense of deviction to that cause for which they are the last full measure of devotion; that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have ded in vain; that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom, and that government of the people, by the people and for the people shall not parish from the earth.—Address of President Lincoln as Cettyburg, Nov. 19, 1863.
