TAX LEVY ORDINANCE No. 20 (New Series)
WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington, in the
County of Clark and Cook and State of Illinois, did on the 11th day of July,
A. D. 1919, pass the same appropriation bill for said Village, for the fiscal
year beginning on the 1st day of May, A. D. 1919, the amount of which is
necessitated as aforesaid, and whereas, the following specific purposes and
objects, which said appropriation bill was fully published on the 16th day of July,
A. D. 1919: Now therefore,
BE IT ORDAINED, That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington,
that there be and is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property within
the corporate limits of said Village for the year A. D. 1919, the total sum of
Fifty One Thousand Six Hundred Dollars for the following specific purposes and
objects, which said appropriation bill, and in the respective cases as follows: To-wit:

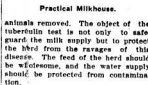
