

BALLINGER TO STAY

Secretary Has Conference With Taft, Will Remain in Cabinet.

DECLARES HE'S NO QUITTER

Carrying Out of Legislation Adopted by Recent Session of Congress is Subject of Discussion.

Brevity, Mass.—Richard A. Ballinger, secretary of the interior, announced after his conference with President Taft today that he will remain in the cabinet. No matter what the result of the conference in investigating committee the secretary declines to resign.

Secretary Ballinger announced that the policy toward public domain lands would encourage the private development. When some one referred to it and the Taft-Bill (H.R. 1047), he said:

"You may call it what you like, but I will call you one thing—it will not be the Taft Bill."

Earlier in the day before seeing Mr. Taft, Ballinger said that he was not a quitter, but would not discuss the subject of his resignation with the president. Mr. Ballinger is quoted positively that he would not quit.

"I am going to do some things through the year," he said.

CHEF JUSTICE FULLER DEAD

Aged Jurist Passes Away Suddenly at Sorrento, Maine.

Har Harbor, Me.—Chief Justice Melville W. Fuller of the United States Supreme court died from heart failure at his summer home in Sorrento at six o'clock Monday morning.

The death of the chief magistrate was unexpected, as he had been in fairly good health lately and there had been no presensory symptoms of any kind.

Death came about six o'clock Monday morning. His daughter, Mrs. Nathaniel Franklin, and Rev. James E. Pomeroy, who has a guest of Justice Fuller at his Sorrento, Colfax, Maine, stay, were with the jurist when he died.

The funeral services will be held at Sorrento and the interment will be at Chicago.

Chief Justice Fuller spent his summer at Sorrento, a summer colony located on Popham beach, five miles from Harbor.

A Great American. To Chief Justice Fuller fell the honor of third rank for length of service as presiding justice of the United States Chief Justice.

The 12 years he was chief justice of the Supreme court of the United States Chief Justice Fuller presided over the court for 34 years.

With the failure came the determination of the rank among the chief justices of history for ability and administrative.

Before Governor Cleveland sent his name to the senate on April 20, 1888, for confirmation as chief justice, he was practically unknown except to members of the legal profession.

His high regard was shown by the fact that he was born on February 11, 1833, he had been known as a well beloved, father who had been in Harvard college and had been in the army.

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HUGHES FOR CHIEF JUSTICE

Governor Will Probably Succeed Melville W. Fuller As Head of Supreme Court.
