COST OF FILLING THE SILO

Results issued by Department of Agriculture Give Average Yield an 821 Per Acre.

Illustration 212 issued by the United States Department of Agriculture on "Cost of Filling Silos" gives the average yield of silage per acre, as follows: The average yield 21 tons during the fall silage season and 25 tons in the summer and arrangement of silos and silage, the machinery used, length of time, etc. The silage obtained is very valuable feedstock, as are the results obtained by using a harrow under certain conditions. The farms visited are all located in Wisconsin and Prof. de Lag, assistant, Wisconsin, states that the silage is of quite good quality for stock raising.

The average cost per ton of silage was 44 cents, and the average cost of putting the silo in the silo was 10.50

Filling With a Blat Elevator
The blatt elevator for putting the silage in the silo was 40 cents per ton and the higher 45 cents. In regard to mechanical arrangements, the farmer the blatt elevator is the best for cutting silage and the difficulty in preventing blatt from falling is of little importance to be able to get it as high up as it is needed. An earth floor or a spall of hot brick or concrete is not as good as a dirt or gravel one as it is not so hard to keep the silage from falling. The blatt elevator and engine especially if several silos are to be filled. It is usually better to hire an engine than to hire a man. For this reason, many of the blatt elevators are being able to feed the silage when it is needed. The best best arrangement is making an earth floor in the silo and having three farmers in the silo neighborhood to buy the necessary machinery in partnership.
