WHY A "FOOD PROBLEM"?

In this country there is no "food problem" in this country for many years to come. We have plenty of idle lands upon which to produce our food, not only for the present, but for all the increase in population for decades in the future. The director of A. B. Campbell, chief commissioner of immigration of Wisconsin, in whose state there are unused land. Mr. Campbell is on record as stating that the unused lands of Wisconsin, Minnesota and Michigan aggregate fully 40,000,000 acres and that its fertility is such that if it were all planted to wheat, it would duplicate the present United States wheat crop. If it were planted to oats, barley and rye, would duplicate those crops as now grown in the whole country or that those lands would grow all the vegetables now produced in the United States. These statements are no less definite. If correct, it is easy to see that there has been a large amount of idle talk upon that phase of the question of future food supply.
