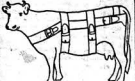

SAVE MANY VALUABLE COWS

Harness Arrangement Will Prevent of Loss of Life to Animals During Calving Time.
Many valuable cows have been lost by the womb or calbed following the calf. In large herds a harness, as shown, will almost always keep in the road when there is any danger. This must be kept on for 15 hours after calving. After which time there is not much danger. The part under the tail should be extra wide and should be put next to the cow's skin. DAILY NOTES

A cross bred cow is a mistake. Dairy cow's udder should be thoroughly cleaned before milking.
"Bloody milk" or that from a sick cow should never be mixed with wholesome milk.
The uncovered cans of milk should be kept in cool water until they are delivered to the creamery.

The stable should not be cleaned or brushed nor should stables or paddocks be cleaned with any of the other of the herd are killed.
All milk should be washed first in cold water then thoroughly cleaned with warm water and finally rinsed and washed with water.
