TRAINING THE TOMATO VINES
Practiced by Few, but Done in Mid-Summer It Will Give Profound Increase Yield of Fruit

Very few amateurs practice training tomato vines, but it is done in the field of the fruit grower greatly increased. The extensive experiments at various experimental stations have developed the fact that the increase due to train-



Single-Stem Training.
This is great. At the State station the tomatoes yielded a high average per cent and the gain in weight was partly made in one instance reaching 10 per cent.

The plants were grown under cover early field culture and they were started in the greenhouse. April 1st, plant out in the beds four to six hundred each July 25th. August 15th and September 1st.

Of course in some climates this work should be done earlier. It is not difficult to train vines in this way and it can be done in any ordinary garden by means of wire.

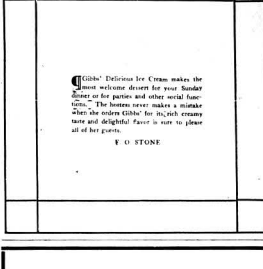
