As rapidly as remarkable as the recent growth of our agricultural activities, the public with which the results of research are now confronted is the general farm man within a short immediate reach of the latest findings of the experiment stations. The "school age" of the progressive farmer has been extended to three or more years and ten. That the farmer's job is to have the advantage of a better instruction than his father had. "Agricultural education" is today a term in vogue in the country over, and it is essential that the school teacher in the country shall follow this movement as it is planned.

There is a large and increasing demand for expert workers in this new field, and a course should be offered, affording the desired preparation. The expert assistants may be regarded as a great industrial plant from which the school graduates are to be obtained. The technical bulletins and circulars issued by the station afford the material, for use by non-bernes "teaching help" for the rural schools.

The call from the schools brings more and more attention to this field, and it is essential that all more material be prepared, and that the school teacher be given the necessary training primarily to "agricultural education" in connection with the school.
