**POSTAL SAVINGS BANK RULES.**  
Continued from first page.

will bear interest at the regular rate. A depositor may at any time withdraw the whole or any part of his deposits to his credit with any interest payable by surrendering savings certificate, properly indorsed, for the amount desired.

A depositor presenting a certificate for payment to full with all interest payable must indorse it on the back in the presence of the postmaster or his representative and the collector. The postmaster or his representative, if satisfied as to the depositor's identity, will then make payment.

When a depositor desires to withdraw only a part of the amount, called for by any certificate the postmaster will cancel the certificate and issue a new certificate covering the amount to be withdrawn. The new certificate will not be dated that the depositor will not lose interest on the amount remaining continuously on deposit.

When a depositor desires to withdraw merely the interest payable on any certificate, instead of indorsing and surrendering the certificate as in case of full payment, he will be required to give his receipt in duplicate for the amount of the interest paid. The postmaster will enter the certificate and return it to the depositor.

In case of the death of the depositor the amount standing to his credit will be paid to the executor or administrator of his estate upon evidence with the necessary requirements.

A woman who opens an account under a maiden name must present her savings certificate at her residence in order that the certificate may be made payable to her in her true name.

A depositor will be permitted to exchange the whole or any part of his deposits in sums of \$20, \$40, \$60, \$80 or \$100 in multiples of \$20 up to and including in United States registered coupon bonds bearing interest at the rate of 4½ per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and redeemable at the pleasure of the United States after one year from date of issue, both principal and interest payable 2½ years from such date in United States gold coin. Such exchange may be made under authority of Treasury and July 1 of each year, provided such bonds are then available.

Bid proposals will be received by the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Lake Zurich, in the County of Lake, and State of Illinois, until 4 o'clock P. M. on the 28th day of February, A. D. 1912 at the Village Hall said Village, for Local Improvement to wit: the construction of a sewerage system of cast iron main pipe, with the hydrants, gate valves, raise boxes and appurtenances. Said system to be located and laid out as follows: Beginning at a point in Robertson Avenue opposite the intersection of the line of S. Bruce's subdivision, and extending south line of lot 3, of block 1, of S. Bruce's subdivision, a distance of 270 feet, then east along the line of Robertson Avenue and Main Street, a distance of 100 feet, then north along the line of Robertson Avenue, and ending at a point in Main street which is 100 feet from the west line of the segment lot in Oak Park. Also in Lake View Place a four inch cast iron water pipe 300 feet long, which shall connect with the four inch water pipe aforesaid in Robertson Avenue, shall be laid along a line which is parallel to and twenty feet from the east line of lot 2, block 1, in block one, of the East Shore Subdivision, and ending at a point opposite the south line of the four inch cast iron water pipe in Robertson Avenue, shall be laid along a line which is parallel to and seventeen feet from the south line of said street, commencing at a point where this line produced intersects the six inch water pipe in Robertson Avenue, and ending at a point opposite the east line of lot 2, block one of S. Bruce's subdivision. Also in Park Avenue, a four inch cast iron water pipe 300 feet long, which shall connect with the four inch cast iron water pipe in Robertson Avenue, shall be laid along a line which is parallel to and twenty feet from the east line of lot 2, block one, at a point where this line produced intersects the six inch water pipe in Robertson Avenue, and ending at a point opposite the line between the Fourth and Eastern Railroads. Also in Plain Street and McHenry Street, a four inch water pipe 200 feet long, which shall connect with the four inch water pipe in Robertson Avenue and Main Street with the line along a line which is parallel to and twenty feet from the east line of said street, commencing at a point in McHenry Road opposite the east line of Robertson Avenue, and ending at a point in Plain Street where this line intersects the Western Right-of-Way line of the State, Julius and Eastern Railroad. Also in the Village of Lake Zurich, in the County of Lake and State of Illinois, according to the ordinance thereto and the plans and specifications Local Improvements of said Village at Village Hall, and at the office of the Engineer of said Village.

Proposals must be addressed to the President of the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Lake Zurich, at Lake Zurich, Illinois, and accompanied with a certified check for an amount equal to ten per cent of the average proposal, on some other form approved by the Board of Local Improvements of said Village at Village Hall, and to be returned by the Board of Local Improvements of said Village at 4 o'clock P. M. on the 28th day of February, A. D. 1912 at said Village Hall.

For each labor and material, the contractor is to be paid in bonds and warrants to draw interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided. The Board of Local Improvements reserves the right to receive and bid on the 28th day of February, A. D. 1912.

No proposal will be considered unless the party offering it fully furnish that he has the means, facilities, together with sufficient pecuniary resources, to fulfill the conditions of the contract and specifications, provided. Contracts or firm bidding must give the individual names with their respective addresses, as well as the name of the firm or company.

The work specified will be let as a whole. The contractor shall furnish a \$5,000.00 Company bond conditioned for the faithful performance of the contract and for the maintenance of said work in good condition for a period of one year.
