**The annual report of Jewel Tea Co. Inc. was released Monday by officials of the company and shows the net profit of the past year at \$1,041,200 compared to \$1,020,000 in 1935. Total assets amounted to \$4,440,000 and a special dividend of \$1.00.**

**Earnings on the 230,000 shares of stock owned by 125,043 compared to \$1.45 per share in 1935. Total assets amounted to \$4,440,000 compared to \$4,200,000 in 1935, an increase of \$240,000. Total liabilities amounted to \$1,041,200 compared to \$1,020,000 in 1935, an increase of \$21,200. Total assets less liabilities amounted to \$3,400,000 compared to \$3,180,000 in 1935, an increase of \$220,000.**

**The company announced a dividend of \$1.00 per share payable on March 1, 1937. The dividend is the highest in the company's history and represents an increase of 25 percent over the dividend of 75 cents paid in 1935. The dividend is payable to shareholders of record as of February 1, 1937.**

**Operations were being carried at 119,474 units, representing the cost of 70,000 units of "wage units" approximately \$1,041,200, representing the cost during the year by the board of directors and paid to all employees stockpiling.**
