Opportunities for Baseball Schooling Offered by I.W.P.A.
Plans for organizing amateur baseball leagues on city or county basis in order to give the students letters of Illinois an opportunity to compete in the National game were announced by Tom Rickman, Chicago, assistant director of recreation for the Illinois State Physical Administration last week. Such leagues will be given an opportunity to compete for state and national championships and representation on the International squad of the American Baseball Congress which visits Mexico in October.
A series of junior baseball schools will be organized in addition to these leagues. Aspiring ball players will be given a chance to work their way up the game and will be schooled by such big league stars as Chuck Grimm, Pie Traynor, Pepper Martin, and others.
Lessons will be given weekly in each community where a school is located and include history work, lab and outside play.
