

Lake County Taxes Show Reduction of

Near Half Million

1934 Mills Will Be Lower in Chicago and Elmhurst

Current taxes in Lake county will be lower than in any other county in the state for last year, according to an official statement received from the state tax commission. The total for Cook and Elmhurst counties are \$1,191,179.15, compared to \$1,854,238.17 for this year.

The total real and personal property tax extensions in the county this year are \$1,628,155.45 and the railroad taxes are \$260,112.15.

Five railroads, including branch lines in Lake county, with a total mileage of 1,113.13 miles, are assessed for the tax extensions. The Chicago and North Western railroad has a valuation of \$17,732.33 on Chicago and North Western, the largest tax extension with \$24,455.15. The taxes for the other railroads are: Elmhurst, \$1,040,325.23; the N. W. Pa. 144,452.45; and the Wisconsin Central, \$11,899.44.

Real estate taxes are to be levied proportionately among the various taxing bodies in towns throughout the county. There were 121,294 separate parcels of real estate in Cook county last year.
