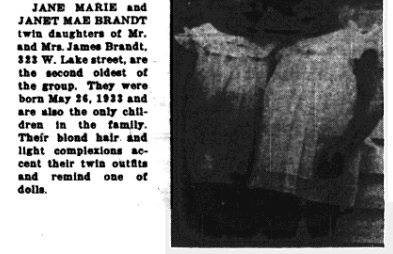

The Birthday Child of the Week

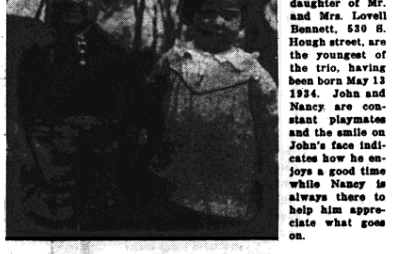
The Birthday Child of the Week column features something unusual this week by having pictures of three sets of twins. One pair had birthdays in April while the other two have theirs in May.
