### State School Aid Small; Senate's **Hearing Reveals**

Hearings of the United State senate committee on education just published, reveal that Illinois ranks at the bottom of the list is axes of state and local government as compared to private income. According to this report, Illin-ois' state and local taxes are 7.1 ols state and local taxes are 7.1
percent of the private income of
the state. This is the lowest of
48 states. In California the percent is 11.2, in Delaware 12.0, and
in New York 12.1. This comparison was made for the year 1830.
This is not the first time Illinois
has been placed lowest on a comparison of taxes as compared to
ability to pay taxes. The "Taxe
