

Last Rites for C. Krause, 77, Today

Funeral services for Conrad Krause, 77 years old, prominent resident of Cuba township, will be held today, Thursday, at 2 o'clock at the funeral home, 145 W. Main street, with Rev. Hermann Koenig officiating. Burial will take place in Evergreen cemetery.

Mr. Krause died at 5 o'clock Tuesday morning. He was taken ill with a stomach disorder last February but had been able to get about until recently.

Born in Hochburg, Austria, on February 19, 1859, he emigrated to this country at the age of 16 and made his home with his late uncle, John Bloner, who resided near Cuba.

He engaged in carpentry work and in 1885 built the store at Cuba which he conducted until 1921. Charles Lederer purchased the business but re-sold it to Mr. Krause in 1923.

Miss Anna Strobach became his bride on May 11, 1883, and they continued to live at Cuba con-

ing the store, retiring from active work 10 years ago. He was a member of the Modern Woodmen of America for the last 37 years. Surviving besides his widow, are three children, Gustie of Cary, Mrs. Frank Kirby at home and Frank of Chicago, and eight grandchildren.

School-Village Suit Hearing Up Monday

Hearing of the litigation suit between the village of Barrington and trustees and directors of school districts will come up in superior court of Cook county Monday, D. B. Maloney, village attorney, reported.

The litigation is based on division of funds held in the First State Bank of Barrington at the time of its closing by the village treasurer, who was also treasurer of school districts involved. Village and school funds were kept in a rotating fund of both the First National Bank and the closed State Bank, and the village treasurer at the time of the closing determined that all money in the defunct institution belonged to the village.

Municipal officials contend that all the money was not theirs, and that the school districts should absorb some of the burden. Hearing on the suit had been delayed pending an attempt for compromise settlement by the village. Following numerous conferences, a plan had progressed satisfactorily, trustees reported, but received a set-back when trustees of the village and school district 4 failed to reach a compromise.

At the board meeting Tuesday night, Earl Hatje, village president, contacted members of the board of education for district 4, requesting a meeting. It planned that another conference may be held before Monday.

Establish Rates on Sewer Connections

Connection charges to the village sewer system were determined at the meeting of village trustees Tuesday, following the presentation of a recommendation approved by Trustee John H. Blanke, chairman of the sewer committee.

It was decided that a charge of \$5 will be assessed all property owners who have previously paid for a sewer, but who are not connected. A charge of \$40 is to be made for property owners wishing to connect to the lines who have not previously paid for a sewer.

Thus, in the sections of town where sewers were installed several years ago and paid for by special assessment, the charge is \$5. In those sections where no sewer is located at present, property owners will pay the cost of constructing the sewers plus the \$40 connection charge.

The charges are to be incorporated in an ordinance for presentation, approval and passage by the board in the near future.

Belted Kingfisher Has an Interesting History

The belted kingfisher, whose scientific name is Ceryle alcyon, has rather an interesting history if one believes in the mythologies, says a writer in the New York World-Telegram. Once upon a time, long and long ago—so long ago that the people of those days believed many things that were told them by poets, prophets and seers—the kingfisher was a man, a king of Trachina, and was called Ceryx. He was the son of Lucifer—which should have got him into plenty trouble—but he had the good luck to marry a faithful woman, Alcyone, daughter of Aeolus, god of the winds.

Ceryx was drowned while on a journey to consult the oracle of Claros. His wife learned of his death and her loss in a dream and went searching for her husband along the sea shore where she found his body in the edge of the water. Her sorrow was so great she threw herself into the sea with a rattling maniacal laugh to drown herself—but the gods were filled with compassion and turned both her and her husband into kingfishers, and called them Alcyon, hence the kingfisher, a name belonging to the Alcyonidae. Halcyon means calm, peaceful; the halcyon days, the winter solstice, when the ancients believed the kingfishers nested in a floating nest at sea and kept the weather peaceful in that way.

Our kingfisher nests in spring in a deep burrow tunneled in a sand bank, five to six feet deep.

Niagara Falls
