

Arlington Heights Defeats Bronks in Gridiron Contest by 13-0 Score

Lake Forest Team Plays Locals Here Saturday at Park

Although Bronchos Outplay Arlington, Backs Fall to Score

Warenes 28, Niles Center 0. Libertyville 18, Grant 18. Lake Forest 26, Leyden 19.

Scoring twice, once on a fumble in the first quarter and again on a pass in the third quarter, the Arlington Heights high school football team won over the Barrington Bronchos Saturday by a score of 13 to 0 in a game played at Northside Park.

Early in the first period, Hull, Cardinal fullback, kicked from his own 40 yard line. Clinge, who was playing safety for Barrington, missed the ball and it rolled over the goal line. Clinge, instead of letting the ball go, jumped for it, fumbled, and an Arlington player recovered. O'Hagen's try for the extra point was blocked.

Score on Pass

In the second quarter, both teams played about evenly although Church, Broncho halfback, intercepted two of Arlington's passes and was pulled down after short gains.

Due to the brilliant open field running of O'Hagen, Arlington safety, who returned Barrington's punts many times back into Barrington territory, the Cardinals got the ball-up to the Bronchos' 18 yard line in the third quarter. O'Hagen then tossed to Lacinia who scored. For the extra point Hull passed to Lacinia.

Bronchos Threaten

During the third period, Jack Shepard, who calls signals for the Bronks, broke away and was pulled down on the Cardinal's 14 yard

line after a gain of 23 yards, but Arlington's line held. Barrington's other big threat was in the last quarter when Church completed a pass to Rice, good for a gain of 34 yards and bringing the ball up to Arlington's 13 yard line, but again the Cardinal line held. At the final whistle Grabenkort received a short pass from Church and was downed on the Arlington 23 yard line.

Keany Clinge, who was injured in the third quarter, was replaced by Thacker, who had been playing center until last week when Coach Paul Clark shifted him to the backfield. He proved himself to be a good driving back.

Outgain Opponents

Statistics show that Barrington made 4 first downs to Arlington's two. The Bronks gained 96 yards, from scrimmage while Arlington gained only 33 yards. The Cardinals were penalized 3 times for a total of 25 yards to the locals' 4 times for 19 yards.

Lake Forest Saturday

Saturday afternoon the warriors from Lake Forest high school will invade Northside park, when the Bronchos will attempt to knock them out of first place. By their showing against Niles Center two weeks ago the Lake Forest gridgers should be the stronger for Niles Center held the Bronchos to a scoreless tie. The kickoff will be at 2:30.

Strange Vinegar Bill

Vinegar provides the story of perhaps the strangest bill ever passed. This bill was introduced in London recently, among a mass of historical documents. It was a \$3,000,000 account paid in 1639 by Louis XIII of France for "vinegar to cool his Majesty's cannon," relates London Answers Magazine. That was a crude sort of vinegar—little else but sour beer. Brewers sold it off cheap, just as butchers sell off scraps of meat. But thousands of men were unable to afford anything else. In the reign of Henry the Eighth some London laborers went on strike until they were granted an extra penny a day for a "noon's quench" of vinegar-beer.
