The book, the first novel of the author, deals with the darkest and least known period of English history. George III is the one outstanding figure of the period. England seems to try to conceal this chapter of its history.

The action, which moves swiftly, centers around one Christopher Harriah who is connected with the House of Hanover. Because of this connection he is used as a tool by Madame de Boucher

to carry out her plot of vengeance against George III. The style is graphic—the scenes portraying undetected, horribly abused children, court intrigue, and hatred. In many cases the situations are decidedly forced, but the 600 pages are engrossing if one is not overcome by the stark realism of the novel.
