

Bronchos Lose Two Cage Games to Palatine and Wauconda Teams

Meet Niles Center, Leyden and Alumni Teams This Week

Inexperience and Lack of Drive in Second Half Leads in Defeats

Due to lack of experience the Barrington High school cage teams dropped lightweight and heavyweight contests to the Palatine Pirates and the Wauconda Bulldogs last Friday and Saturday, respectively. In Friday's game with Palatine the Bronchos were baffled by the Pirates light nose defense and failed to make their own defense hold. Although the Bronchos had a good first half, the Pirates won by a score of 26 to 16.

After a close first half the Pirates started on a scoring spree and with Captain O'Brien paving the way, scored 25 points in the second half. The Bronchos, who were content with their goals, scored only a field goal and a charity shot all during the second half of the game.

O'Brien, who played between the two Bronchos gave on defense, intercepted a number of passes and broke into the clear. He scored three of his four field goals in this way. O'Brien took the scoring honors for the Pirates with 11 points, while Captain Eric Rice scored seven of the locale 16 points.

Wauconda Wins

The Wauconda Bulldogs invaded the local gym Saturday and defeated the Bronchos in the quarter after being on the short end of a 22 to 15 score at the close of the third period. The locale were strong in the first half, but as in previous games, showed up enough in the second half to let their opponents pass them up and win. With Koppin and Bobner starring, the Bulldogs scored five field goals and a free throw in the last quarter while the Bronchos only contributed charity shot to their score.

This defeat marked the Bronchos' fourth loss in four starts, being downed by Crystal Lake, Arlington Heights, Palatine, and then Wauconda. It is hoped that next Friday, when the Bronchos travel to Niles Center, they will be able to give a better showing than they have in their four previous games. Niles Center has a strong squad this season as was shown by their 31 to 15 win over Arlington. The Bronchos are rated as underdogs in the coming contest and they may surprise everyone and come out on top. On Tuesday and Wednesday of the following week the Bronchos will meet Leyden and the Alumni. The Leyden game will be played on the Franklin Park floor.

Ponies Drop Two

The Ponies also shared the sorrows of defeat with the Bronchos by losing to Palatine and Wauconda by scores of 19 to 14 and 16 to 14, respectively. Outside of a bad third quarter the Ponies played evenly with the Palatine lights, but Palatine scored three field goals in this period and maintained the lead which these goals gave them.

In the Wauconda game the locale failed to get ahead and Wauconda held a one or two point lead all through the game. This defeat also was the fourth of the season for the Ponies.
