

Town Assessors Begin Quadrennial Real Assessments

Anticipate Taxable Property
Increase Due to New
Building

Assessors in the 18 Lake county townships this week began their quadrennial management of real estate and improved real estate in their respective townships. The 1939 assessment books which will carry the property valuations in the county during the next four years, were turned over Friday by County Clerk Jay B. Moore to the assessors.

An effort will be made to equalize the assessment for taxing purposes. It was determined at a meet-

ing of all assessors last Wednesday, E. K. Bryant, of the state commission, said that the real property assessments in Lake county for taxing purposes during the past several months have averaged between 2 and 2 1/2 per cent of the actual value.

Personal property valuations also will be made by the assessors. The 1939 personal property assessment for 1938 totaled \$1,324,949.00, or an increase of \$124,841.75, or a decrease of 17.72 per cent over the 1937 assessment.
