THINK NOTHING OF IT
On Monday, May 23, I attended the dinner given at the Mayflower Hotel in Washington by the American Retail Federation on the principal program was the President of the United States. To three business men be mentioned the startling intelligence that one billion dollars will be required this year to pay interest on the public debt of the federal government. Their faces and approximations were, however, quickly brushed aside by his reassurance that, "Our national debt, after all is an internal debt, owed not only by the nation but to the nation. If our children have to pay interest on it, they will pay that interest to themselves."

A CHANCE FOR REAL SERVICE
The so-called "monopoly" committee in Washington is currently preparing to turn its attention to another question which it has claimed, puzzles many government economists. The committee wonders why, with billions of dollars of idle savings in the bank, investment in private enterprises has been so sluggish in this country.

INVERTORS WHO HAVE MONEY
Investors who have the money have maintained an abiding interest in the country in getting their funds to work productively because they fear government action on two fronts; legislation and taxation. The large majority say that they are worried over existing laws and commissions which are harmful to business and just as much concerned about the possibility of future laws and taxes.

IN THIS RIGHT DIRECTION
A congressional committee has concluded an exhaustive study of the social security taxing system and has made several commendable recommendations for changes. One of the recommendations is that the tax on the pay envelopes of more than 30 million workers, for it concerns the amount of taxes that are extracted from wages. At present workers have 1 per cent of all their earnings turned over to the government for a so-called social security fund even before the wages are paid.
