#### Double Header Main Attractions Billed at Grayslake Friday

Pro wrestling will assume international importance in Lake county Friday night when Tommie Barron, the undisputed champion of all Europe, climbs through the ropes and into the ring under the stars in Park's Arena near Grayslake to make his local debut against Hans Schaub, powerful German challenger, in one of two matches billed as a double wind-up attraction.

Barron, billed as the most formidable wrestler in Europe these hours since the day of George Hackenschmidt, was discovered by the former world's champion, Jim London, who the latter was touring Europe last summer. Bloodied an unbroken string of victories in both the U. S. and Europe, the latest Grand Slam being his over the now wrestler who may be able to beat over all combined world champions and restore order to the chaotic condition of the wrestling ring.

Hans Schaub, his tough opponent, drew an introduction to local sport followers who have been watching him in the arena since last last summer with only a few exceptions. He is now 35 years of age and has a record of 100 wins and 10 losses.

His manager, Jimmy McMillan, Ashton's own claim to fame, has been successful in getting out and coming Archer over Schaub's handsome German opponent, who had been considered a tough headliner by the semi-wind-up of the evening. Schaub has speed, cleverness, and a wonderful physique, and Pacific coast writers are predicting a bright future for him in the padded square.
