A special meeting of the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held on January 15, 1973 at 7:30 P.M. at Countryside School in the Village of Barrington Hills.

Minutes of the December meeting were presented to the Board for approval. A motion was heard and seconded approving the minutes. Motion carried.

TREASURER: Mr. Tucker reported in Mr. Welby's absence.

He noted that the road and property taxes are in excess of the amount estimated. This is due to the fact that many of the protested taxes from previous years have been collected. The income from traffic fines is down. \$\\$5,643.00 has been sent to us in Revenue Sharing funds. Expensewise, we are exceding the budget in the area of building inspector. A motion was made and seconded approving the Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

FINANCE: The following bills were presented to the Board for payment:

A motion was made and seconded approving the bills for payment. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays, noone absent. Motion carried.

Due to the fact that several NSF checks have been given the clerk to pay for building permits, Mr. Tucker recommended that in the future Mr. Crumrine's office require payment with either certified checks or cashier's checks. Board agreed.

President McLaughlin stated that the expenses for the Centex hearings are going to be paid jointly by Barrington Hills, Barrington and Sough Barrington. BACDG is to pay up to \$ 10,000 of the attorney's fees. Our Village will be responsible for 25% of the balance due after the use of the BACOG funds.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress noted that Chapel Road is officially closed until spring, at which time repairs will be made. Signs have been erected, and only local traffic is to use the road.

The Cuba Road Bridge will be bid upon this spring. Hart Road is essentially completed. The shoulders need completing and seeding, which will be done when weather permits.

At this time Mr. Fentress discussed in detail the proposed Road Ordinance. He has met with Wight and updated all areas of our ordinance. The Board accepted it conditionally subject to approval by the Plan Commission. It will become part of the new Subdivision Ordinance. The Street Standards will appear in two separate documents. Copies will be mailed to the Plan Commission so that they can make recommendations and/or approve the Ordinance.

Mr. Fentress presented three bills to be covered by MFT Funds. Lakeland Construction, \$ 4,664.19, Liberty Asphalt Products, Inc. \$ 29,944.18 and Wight Consulting Engineers, \$ 107.50. Motion made and seconded for approval. Roll call. 6 ayes, 0 nays, 0 absent. Motion carried.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. Grigsby reported 68 routine calls and investigations, 30 accidents, 37 citations, 2 burglaries, 1 stolen vehicle. The new police cars have been delivered and the radio changeover is being made.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Bateman reported that the Sub-division Ordinance is going to Mr. Criag for any comments he might have. He urged the Villagers to attend the Centex Hearing being held Friday January 19, at the Barrington Village Hall at 2:00 P.M.

A letter from the Zoning Board of Appeals was read noting a variation had been granted to Mr. Dernell in the division of his lOplus acres into two lots.

A special use permit was discussed in reference to building lakes and ponds. Mrs. Blanchard noted that about two years ago it was decided that permits should be obtained through the Conservation offices serving our Village, free of charge.

HEALTH: Mrs. Thompson reported that she had had many inquiries about the size of Mr. m. Puson's barn/arena. A question arose as to drainage on already marshy land. The whole matter was referred back to Mr. Crumrine's office for further investigation.

ABMINISTRATION: Mr. Denton reported that people/were taxed outside our Village had notified the Telephone Company of the errors.

BUILDING: Mr. McLaughlin reported that permits for 1 septic system, 1 barn and 3 houses had been granted in December. A yearly breakdown of permits was read. (Copy attached)

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craigreported that a hearing had been set for January 24 at 10:00 A.M. by the Illinois Commerce Commission. Fox River Grove will also appear at that time to protest the erection of the Commonwealth Edison poles.

The suit against the owners of the unfinished house on Surrey
Lane has been filed and an answer is expected by February 7th.

The illegal barn on Healy Road was erected without a permit and at one point is 30 feet from the lot line. The owner is being 1/15/73

notified that it is to be moved or taken down. The owner may file for a variation and hearing from the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Mr. Craig gave a general reminder of the upcoming Village election on April 17th.

President McLaughlin noted that the salary of the Village Clerk is set by law prior to the election. A motion was heard and seconded increasing the salary of the Clerk to \$ 300.00 monthly. Roll call. 6 ayes, 0 nays, 0 absent. Motion carried.

At this time Mr. Lewis "nsel appreared before the Board representing Mr. Bud Kaufman. At the time of sale of the former Stephani property, the broker indicated that the land was not in the Village. Mr. Kaufman divided the land into 5 acre parcels and appreared before the McHenry County Board. Land has been sold to various individuals. At present there is doubt as to whether or not some portion of the land is in our Village, and if so, the lot widths do not meet our lot size requirements. Several alternatives are open to the owners. It was determined that before taking any legal steps, the Village boundaries should be defined. Files and ordinances are to be double checked.

Mr. Helfrick, a resident, asked Mr. Grigsby about the Security report. Mr. Grigsby stated that it is not yet ready for release, but that when ready, it will be mailed to the Villagers.

There being no further business, a motion was made and seconded for adjournment. Motion carried.
