ROADS AND BRIDGES: In the absence of Mr. Fentress Mr.

Craig presented the State resolution for application of a permit to erect a light on location "A" on Route 62 opposite Helm Road.

Motion was made and seconded approving the resolution. Motion carried. Mr. Craig then presented a second resolution to the Board recommending the Village approve contract with Commonwealth Edison for installation of said light at the cost of \*8.20 monthly. A motion was made and seconded approving the resolution. Roll call. 3 ayes, no nays, 3 absent. Motion carried.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. ateman had no report. However, he noted that the Barrington Plan Commission had not approved plans for a proposed shopping center.

President Hayward made the following appointments to fill the vacancies on the Plan Commission. Mr. Joseph F. Siroteck to replace Mrs. Armstrong and Mr. L.J. Klein to replace Mr. Mortimer. Motion was made and seconded approving the appointments. Motion carried.

HEALTH: Mrs. Thompson presented her report of the training

seminar held by the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad and the Milwaukee Road, Northern Illinois Planning Commission and the Chicago Area Transportation Study Groups requesting support of House Bill 3126 creating a single agency to coordinate 27 public carriers. (CEMATS) She concluded that NIPCI and CATS are relatively cool about the proposal and that the two railroads are in support of it. No action was taken by the Study Group.

BUILDING: No report. President Hayward directed Mr. Bateman to appoint a study group to go over the Subdivision Ordinances before the next Plan Commission meeting. Mrs. Thompson was appointed to the study group.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig reported that he had made an application to the Illinois Commerce Commission for a years extension of the Commission's order concerning the Hart Road crossing, in as much as the Village of Barrington has approved a new road plan. A hearing has been set for February 17 by the Illinois Commerce Commission.

The following resolution was presented to the Board;
RESOLVED: By the Board of Trustees of the Village of
Barrington Hills that the Zoning Board of Appeals of said Village
be and it hereby is requested to hold a public hearing in the
manner required by law and to make written findings and recommendations to the Board of Trustees on a proposal by said Board
of Trustees to amend Sec. 6.6 ( ) of the Zoning Ordiance entitled
"Authorized Variations" by adding the following thereto:

"(9) To permit increases in the height of fences and walls permitted as obstructions in required yards."

" motion was made and seconded approving the resolution. Motion carried.

Mr. Craig reported that it is hoped to postpone and extend court proceedings on the Windrush Lane matter until work can be done on it in the spring.

Mr. Craig will notify the Independent Postal System of the Village resolution.

The Riding Club will meet informally with President Hayward to discuss the problems entailed in turning the Riding Center over paringlon Pack District to the Forest Freserve ystem.

In response to Mr. Keller's question from the audience, Chief Hummel explained that snowmoblies cannot operate on public road ways nor within 15 feet of public roadways, they must be registered and that registration must be prominently displayed. They can operate on private land with permission. Anyone upon whose land they operate without permission may file a complaint against them.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned for an executive session.
