MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

A regular meeting of the President Pro-tem and Board of trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held on March 26, 1973 at Countryside School at 7:30 P.M. in the Village of Barrington Hills.

Mr. Tucker made a motion to appoint Raymond J. Grigsby
President Pro-tem for this March 26, 1973 Village Board Meeting,
seconded. Motion carried.

Minutes of the February meeting were presented to the Board for approval, corrections were made on pages 3 and 4. Mr. Tucker made a motion to approve the minutes as corrected, seconded.

Motion Carried.

TREASURER: Mr. Welby reported that a separate bank account has been set up on the Revenue Sharing Funds. Mr. Welby reported that as of February we have received revenue on all of the utilities. This month we received 4 or 5 thousand dollars more in property taxes. All taxes are now in on property taxes. On the disbursements on the financial statements in total comparing the 10 months to the budget for entire year we are alright.

Mr. Welby also reported that the Revenue Sharing Funds will be shown as the Motor Fuel Funds in terms of the transaction, receipts, and disbursements. Motion made and seconded. Roll call. 4 ayes, O nays, 3 absent. Motion carried.

FINANCE: Mr. Tucker presented the bills to the Board for approval:

A motion was heard and seconded approving the bills for payment.
Roll call. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 3 absent. Motion carried.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress reports that he and Mr. Renshaw looked over the Village roads for spring and summer repairs. They found most of the roads in good condition and these roads will not be seal coated again this year. There are some roads that are broken up and need repairing and Chapel Road's grade has to be raised, because of flooding. On the roads needing repairs bids will be obtained and this should take 30-45 days.

On the Cuba Road bridge matter, bids were obtained with the low bidder being E.M. Melahn Company at \$28,847.45. Wight Engineering will draw up the contracts for us when the bid has been awarded. A question was raised as to the legality of the State or County to force the Village to do this. A motion was made for a tentative approval accepting the low bid pending investigation by our attorney on the legality of this matter, seconded. Roll call. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 3 absent. Motion carried.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. Grigsby reported 114 routine investigations, 30 accidents, 112 citations, 1 burglary, and 1 theft.

Mr. Grigsby read a report from Congressman, Robert McClory, on Federal Programs for Combating Crime. Where in particular having established law enforcement assistance administration which provides federal funds. Mr. Grigsby has written him a letter as to how our Village can participate in these funds and will report back on this at the next meeting.

Mrs. Thompson asked Chief Hummel about the mini bike problem in the area and if anything could be done about it. Chief Hummel stated that investigations were being conducted to bring this problem under control.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Bateman reported that a Court Order has been extended by Lake County stopping all activity for the Bartlett Properties in Lake Barrington with the intention of possibly extending it to a permanent Court Order.

The Subdivision Ordinance will be reported on at next meeting.

HEALTH: Mrs. Thompson reported there have been a few sick racoons reported in the Village this past month.

BUILDING: Mr. Denton absent. No report.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig reported that the Commonwealth Edison Hearings are concluded. At the last hearing films were exhibited by Mr. Bateman which made an effective impression. Also at the last hearing Fox River Grove withdrew their proposal of alternate routes. Mr. Craig reported it would possibly be 3 months before the final results of the hearings were decided.

Mr. Craig reported that on Thursday, March 22, 1973 an order was obtained from McHenry County for the demolition of the house on Surrey Lane and the filling in of the septic tank. We will proceed as rapidly as we can to have the demolition completed.

Mr. Craig reported that a hearing has been set on the Old Heidelburg Condemnation for April 23, 1973 and he expects it will be heard and completed on that day.

Liquor licenses - Saines Restuarants new owners are to file for a liquor license right away.

The last matter is in regards to temporary weight limits on various roads in the Village pursuint to the Village Ordinance 70-01. There is authority to prohibit traffic or temporarily impose a weight limit on roads in case of unsafe conditions or serious deterioration to the roads due to climatic conditions. The Police department under the direction of the President Pro-tem made a limit of 10 tons effective March 6, 1973 with signs installed on all Village roads north of County Line Road and also the following roads south of County Line Road, Old Dundee, Stover, Woodcreek, Hawthorne Lane, Dundee Lane, Lakeview Lane. I make a motion that a resolution be passed by the Board ratifying this temporary limit and extending the limit for up to 90 days from March 6, 1973 but subject to cancellation by the Police Department with approval by President or President Pro-tem. Motion seconded. Roll call. 4 ayes. O nays, 3 absent. Motion carried.

PRESIDENT: No report.

NEW BUSINESS: Mr. Grigsby reported a vacancy on the Zoning Board of appeals due to Bev. Pattishall's resignation. Mr. Grigsby made a motion for a resolution to be passed to appoint Pauline Goltra Armstrong to replace Bev. Pattishall for the ensuing term. Motion seconded. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS: Mr. Grigsby advised Mrs. Thompson and Mr. Bateman that although they are resigning from their positions on the Village Board their presence is required at the April meeting.

Mrs. Thompson inquired of the attorney if there was an ordinance to protect private property from damage by trucks from neighboring construction sites. Mr. Craig stated there was no ordinance to cover this.

There being no further business, Mr. Grigsby asked for comments from the audience. Mr. W. H. Nottke stated that the notification of election was improper as it was published to early on March 8, 1973. Mr. Craig will check on this and republish the notification.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.
